

**RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF  
THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT  
BERTHOLD RESERVATION**

- WHEREAS,** This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act, and
- WHEREAS,** The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes generally authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS,** The Indian Health Service is hosting the Remote Area Medical Clinic which provides medical care such as: spay/neuter services, vaccinations, parasite control and castration for dogs, cats and horses on the Fort Berthold Reservation July 17-20, 2000; and
- WHEREAS,** The Remote Area Medical Clinic in 1999 treated 626 animals and provided services to the people of Fort Berthold at a savings cost to the people of \$10,000; and
- WHEREAS,** The Indian Health Service is providing housing and requests \$100 from the each of the Segment communities to provide meals for the veterinarians for a total request of \$600; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** the Tribal Business Council hereby grants \$600 to Mary Fredericks, Service Unit Sanitarian to pay for costs of meals for the Remote Area Medical Clinic veterinarians.

**CERTIFICATION**

Dear Mr. Hall:

Once again we are planning to host the Remote Area Medial Clinic on the Fort Berthold Reservation July 17-22, 2000. The RAM Clinic provides medical care such as: spay/neuter services, vaccinations, parasite control, and castrations for dogs, cats and horses—all free of charge to the pet owners. It is up to each community to provide housing and meals during their stay with us.

Last year the Three Affiliated Tribes contributed \$100 for each community (\$600 total), to help the communities provide meals to the veterinarians. The services they provide saved the people of Fort Berthold over \$10,000, and treated 626 animals.

We are again asking your assistance in providing funds to help with the meals for each site. The total amount of \$600 will provide for their meals while we host them on the Fort Berthold Reservation. Your assistance in this matter is greatly appreciated.
