

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD INDIAN RESERVATION



- WHEREAS, The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes generally authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of the Tribes and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, The National Endowment for the Arts is accepting applications for preservation of cultural heritage through projects that may include but are not limited to festivals, exhibits, publications, and other presentations of artists and art forms that reflect and increase the public's appreciation for our diverse cultural traditions; apprenticeships and other forms of instruction that pass artistic repertoire, techniques, and traditions on to future generations; and documentation, recording, or conservation of highly significant works of arts, artifacts, built or designed elements, collections of arts, or of cultural traditions and practices; and
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes hereby authorizes the Tourism and Independence Program to seek funding through the National Endowment for the Arts in order to further develop cultural heritage preservation and cultural interpretation initiatives for the Mandan, Hidatsa, and Arikara Nation.
