

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD INDIAN RESERVATION

A Resolution entitled, "The Hidatsa Spelling of Bird Woman"

- **WHEREAS,** This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and
- WHEREAS, The Three Affiliated Tribes Constitution authorizes and empowers the Mandan, Hidatsa & Arikara Tribal Business Council to engage in activity on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, in the absence of a standard alphabet for the Hidatsa language, the State of North Dakota used the English alphabet to spell the Hidatsa word for Bird Woman, and
- WHEREAS, to ensure the most accurate Hidatsa pronunciation for Bird Woman, North Dakota consulted with linguists and adopted a linguistic spelling whereby a 'k' followed by a vowel is pronounced as a hard 'g'; and
- WHEREAS, the majority of English speaking people mispronounce SAKAKAWEA because unknown written words are pronounced phonetically rather than linguistically resulting in 'Sakakawea' being pronounced with an emphasis on 'K' rather than a hard 'G"; and
- WHEREAS, the most correct English spelling for the Hidatsa word—Bird Woman—is not SAKAKAWEA, and
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes hereby adopts 'SACAGAWEA' as the spelling that most closely represents the Hidatsa pronunciation for the word Bird Woman.
