

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD INDIAN RESERVATION

A Resolution Entitled: "Approval of Land Exchange between the Three Affiliated Tribes and Anita Deane"

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act and having adopted a Constitution and By-laws pursuant to said Act; and
- WHEREAS, Article HI of the Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes provides that the Tribal Business Council is the governing body of the Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, Article IX, Section 6 of the Constitution of the Three Affiliated Lribes authorizes the Tribal Business Council to acquire by exchange of tribal land any lands or interests in land for and on behalf of the Tribe, subject to the approval of the Secretary of the Interior; and
- WHEREAS, Anita Deane, 301-U1363, a member of the Three Affiliated Tribes, has offered to exchange an individual ¼ interest containing 80 acres in Allotment #1774, which is legally described as E1/2 Sec.28, T151N., R94W., 5th Principal Meridian containing 320 acres, in exchange for Tribal Allotment 317 A-A, which is legally described as Lot 1 and 2 Sec. 04, T149N., R90W., 5th Principal Meridian containing 78.37 acres total; and
- WHEREAS, The estimated value of Allotment #1774 is \$8000 and the estimated value of Tribal Allotment #317A-A is \$8000; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Business Council has determined that the proposed exchange meets the criteria of Article IX, Section 6 of the Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes and has further determined that it is in the best interest of the Tribes to acquire the ¼ interest of Anita Deane in Allotment #1774 in exchange for Tribal Allotment 317 A-A.



NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes in accordance with the power vested in it by Article IX, Section 6 of the Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes hereby approves to acquire the following described individual ¼ interest in land from Anita Deane in exchange for Tribal Allotment #317 A-A, Lot 1 & 2 Sec. 4, T149N., R90W., containing 78.37 acres:

Allotment #1774, E1/2 Sec. 28, T151N., R94W., containing 320 acres.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tribal Business Council authorizes the Chairman and Secretary to sign all documents necessary to effectuate this exchange; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that in accordance with Article IX, Section 6 of the Constitution this transaction shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary of Interior or his authorized representative.
