

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD INDIAN RESERVATION

A Resolution entitled, "Adoption of new laws - Child Support and Enforcement"

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act and having adopted a Constitution and By-laws under said Act; and
- WHEREAS, Pursuant to Article III, Section 1 of the Constitution and By Laws of the Three Affiliated Tribes, the Tribal Business Council is the governing body of the Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, Article I of the Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes expressly provides that the jurisdiction of the Three Affiliated Tribes shall extend to all persons and all lands, including lands held in fee, within the exterior boundaries of the Fort Berthold Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 3 of the Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes specifically grants to the Tribal Business Council all necessary sovereign authority legislative and judicial for the purpose of exercising the jurisdiction granted by the people of the Three Affiliated Tribes in Article I of the Constitution; and
- WHEREAS, Pursuant to Article VI, Section 5 (1) of said Constitution, the Tribal Business Council has the power to adopt resolutions regulating the procedures of the Tribal Business Council and other Tribal agencies and Tribal officials on the Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Business Council has established the Three Affiliated Tribes Division of Child Support Enforcement (hereinafter "TAT DCSE") pursuant to Resolutions 05-36-NH and 07-185-VJB "because the children are the most vital resource to the continued existence and integrity of the Three Affiliated Tribes and there exists a compelling interest in promoting and maintaining the health and wellbeing of tribal children;" and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Business Council acknowledges the financial difficulties and hardships that tribal children and families face from the lack of a formal child support enforcement program within the Fort Berthold Reservation; and

Highlights from DOMESTIC RELATIONS CODE Title V as prepared by NTJRC consultant, Catherine Bryan.

- Sections 5-4-0 through 5-4-61 of this chapter speak to the federal regulations at 45 CFR 309.90(a)(1) and 45 CFR 309.100 and are based on an updated Uniform Parentage Code. The current FBTC, Chapter 5-17 (Uniform Parentage Act) partially meets the federal regulations. However, the genetic testing provisions and those on the voluntary acknowledgment of paternity in the current code, among others, are outdated and based on old ND law.
- Proposed Code Title 5, Chapter 6 Tribal Child Support Guidelines: Sections 0 through 20 of this chapter speak to the federal regulations at 45 CFR 309.105. The current FBTC does not have a uniform set of guidelines. Under the federal regulations, 45 CFR Part 309.105, Tribes must have a uniform set of child support guidelines (enacted as code or promulgated as court rule for example) to be eligible for funding as a comprehensive program.
- Proposed Code Title 5, Chapter 6 Tribal Child Support Act Sections 0 through 75 of this Chapter speak to the federal regulations at 45 CFR 309. The current FBTC child support chapters Chapters 5-08.1 (Civil Remedies for Child Support), 5-09 (Parent and Child), and 5-12.1 (Reciprocal Enforcement of Support) are outdated and do not address several components required under the federal regulations. For example, the current code does not sufficiently address modification of a child support order, income withholding and employer duties, location of NCPs, CPs, and assets, collection and distribution (including handling arrearages), and full faith and credit and registration of child support orders from foreign jurisdictions. The current code regarding registration of foreign child support orders is based on old ND law which was created decades ago before the adoption of UIFSA by states or PWRORA which is the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA). For the first time in the history of the title IV-D program, PRWORA authorized tribes and tribal organizations to operate child support enforcement programs like states do.
- In addition, the code does not speak to the creation and duties/responsibilities of the TAT DCSE.

- WHEREAS, It has been a substantial period of time since the child support provisions of the Fort Berthold Tribal Code were updated, amended, and revised to reflect the changes in policy, procedure, and other law that occur over time in the area of child support and enforcement; and
- WHEREAS, Revisions to the child support law would also allow for compliance with the federal laws applicable to TAT DCSE's Start-Up Grant; and
- WHEREAS, Policies and procedures for TAT DCSE will be developed to follow the new Tribal laws with regard to child support and will ensure compliance with federal grant provisions; and
- WHEREAS, The newly developed child support laws, after review by the Tribal Legal Department, have been presented to the Tribal Business Council and are attached to this Resolution; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Business Council finds that there is a need for update, amendment, and revision of the current child support laws of the Tribes in the best interests of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, Based on its review and discussion of the attached provisions, it is the considered judgment of the Tribal Business Council that such provisions should be approved and adopted and added to the Code of Laws of the Three Affiliated Tribes.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes hereby approves and adopts the attached Tribal Parentage Act, Tribal Child Support Act, and Tribal Child Support Guidelines which are to be added to the Fort Berthold Tribal Code (the Code of Laws of the Three Affiliated Tribes) as chapters 24, 25, and 26 of Title V and are forthwith incorporated into the Code of Laws of the Three Affiliated Tribes and are to be effective immediately; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that Subchapter 5-08.1, "Civil Remedies for Child Support," Subchapter 5-09, "Parent and Child," Subchapter 5-12.1, "Civil Remedies for Child Support," and Subchapter 5-17, "Uniform Parentage Act" of the Fort Berthold Tribal Code are hereby rescinded and repealed.
