

## RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD INDIAN RESERVATION

A Resolution entitled, "Approval to lease 23.34 Acres of Tribal Fee Lands Located in Mountrail County to Marathon Oil Company, for Oil and Gas Development on the Fort Berthold Reservation"

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and said Act and having adopted a Constitution and By-Laws pursuant to said Act; and
- WHEREAS, The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes generally authorizes and empowers the Mandan, Hidatsa & Arikara Tribal Business Council to engage in activity on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, Article III of the Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes Provides that the Tribal Business Council is the governing body of the Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VI, Section 5(1) of the Constitution, the Tribal Business Council has the power to adopt resolutions regulating the procedures of the Tribal Business Council and other tribal agencies and tribal officials on the Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 5(i) of the Constitution specifically authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council of the Tribe to make assignments and leases of Tribal lands and otherwise to manage tribal lands, interests in Tribal lands, and property upon such lands, in conformity with Article IX of the Constitution; and
- WHEREAS, Article IX of the Constitution specifically authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to manage and lease or otherwise deal with tribal lands and resources in accordance with law; and
- WHEREAS, The Fort Berthold Indian Reservation of the Three Affiliated Tribes comprises approximately 1,000,000 acres and had within it potentially significant oil and gas resources as it lies within the generally accepted geologic formation known as the Williston Basin, a proven oil field since the early 1950's; and
- **WHEREAS**, Marathon Oil Company desires to lease this tract at \$250.00 per bonus acre, 18.75% royalty and \$2.50 rental for a one year term; and



**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** That the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes hereby affirms and ratifies its approval of the lease for oil and gas development of said tribal mineral located within the following:

T.151 N-R93W Section 18, 30 (totaling 23.34 acres) (that part of the Missouri Riverbed within said lands) Located in Mountrail County in North Dakota; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairman to execute an oil and gas lease or leases, as may be necessary, on behalf o the Tribes for the development of oil and gas on the properties described and under the terms specified.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation, in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Three Affiliated Tribes, hereby declares that this Resolution shall expressly supersede and waive the leasing procedure set forth by regulatory provision and policy, including among others, the advertisement and bidding process;

## CERTIFICATION

I, the undersigned, as Secretary of the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation, hereby certify that the Tribal Business Council is composed of (7) members of whom (5) constitute a quorum, were present at a Regular Meeting thereof duly called, noticed, convened, and held on the low day of whom (5) that the foregoing Resolution was duly adopted at such Meeting by the affirmative vote of members, members opposed, members abstained, members not voting, and that said Resolution has not been rescinded or amended in any way.
