Special Council

Chairman James Hall called the meeting to order at 1:00 P.M. on June 10, 1960.

Present: Thomas Bluestone, Guy Fox, John Starr, Leland Hall, James Hall,

Valentine Wells, John White, John Wilkinson, B. J. Youngbird.

Tardy: B. J. Youngbird

Absent: Charles Fox

This is a special meeting and we will start out with this resolution on this \$30.00 deal. Other reservations are up to \$35.00 but the Superintendent thought it should be brought down to \$25.00.

Leland Hall made a motion to write up a resolution at \$30.00 per day for outside trips for the Council. Second, motion carried.

Chairman James Hall: I called Ina Hall and told her that the Council recommended to Mr. Pensneau to raise her wages.

Guy Fox moved to approve expense money of \$75.00 for Ina Hall.

Second

Vote: 6 for, 0 opposed, 2 abstentions, Chairman not voting. Motion Carried.

Chairman James Hall: Here is this Margaret Bird Bear's group that had to go to Lake Metigoshe. It was explained by the Credit Committee. What is your thoughts and action?

Motion made to give \$50.00 to Mrs. Margaret Bird Bear taking LH children to Lake Metigoshe. This money to be taken from the general council funds and transferred to the emergency loan fund. Second, Vote: 6 for, 0 opposed, 1 abstention. Motion carried.

Chairman James Hall: I received a letter and I have lost it, but I read the contents. This letter is in connection with the Girl Scouts Camp in the recreational site west of the bridge. The girl scout leader, Janice Applequist stated they were grateful for having the provilege of being able to use the camping grounds.

Mr. Whitman stated he received a letter also and they, the girl scouts cancelled their camping at the recreational grounds.

John Starr: If you feel what he is asking, that he should be given that. Now we are taking or requested \$30.00 a day on outside trips. He is going to be needed sometime again in the future. He is always game to help us whenever we need him.

Motion made to a prove the request of Carl Whitman Jr., and justification on mileage for auditing the Three Affiliated Tribes accounts and by resolution 60-24. Second, motion carried.

Carl: I wish to make this known, my services are available anytime you need it.

Guy Fox: The request is pretty well understood, it is justified. He is asking for less for the mileage. Yesterday I voted against it.

Chairman James Hall: Here is the resolution on the raise in the perdiem rate from \$20.00 to \$30.00 a day on special trips.

Motion made to approve the resolution 60-24. Second, motion carried.

Guy Fox moved to take Judge David Little Swallow along to Riverdale. Second, motion carried.

Motion made to pay Carl Whitman by resolution. Second, motion carried.

Chairman James Hall have the Superintendent explain about the \$50,000.00 to be transferred to land purchases. Sall Mr. Morken.

- B. J. Youngbird moved that Mrs. Margaret Brazer be given first chance to buy Mrs. Little Malnourie's land and if for some reason she does not take the land, the Tribe purchase the land. Motion seconded by John White, Sr. Motion carried.
- B. J. Youngbird stated that the White Shield Dance Society were to take care of the Nixon deal. The presentation of a war bonnet to Vice President Nixon for president and that the White Shield group to put on a show or ceremony and adopt Vice President Nixon into the Tribe.
- Mr. Youngbird gave an explanation of how they proposed and when to present a war bonnet for the occasion just mentioned above. That the Tribe had to purchase the war bonnet to use for this ceremony.

Motion made to rescind the previous action on giving the White Shield Dance Society the presentation to Vice President Nixon at Minot on June 20, 1960. Second, motion carried.

Guy Fox: I believe White Shield is afraid to take the responsibility on this presentation.

B. J. Youngbird: Whe whole tribe should be represented by somone that can.

More discussion on the Nixon presentation.

B. J. Youngbird: We should have the Chairman James Hall take part. We should hear from the recreational committee.

Page 3

Motion made to leave the Nixon presentation to the recreational committee for arrangements and presentation of war bonnet on June 20, 1960 and the Three Affiliated Tribes purchase a war bonnet for \$30.00 to be presented to Vice President Nixon. Second, motion carried.

John White: Let us take up this warehouse paint job. What are the wages to be paid to the painters? Since the Council is to be away I would like to have to go ahead signal.

Motion made to have John White, Sr. hire man and supervise the painting of the Tribal Warehouse. Second, motion carried.

Remarks: What is the wage scale?

Motion made to pay the painters \$1.00 an hour. Second, motion carried.

Discussion on the group that are to perform a cermony at Minot for Vice President Nixon.

Motion made to allow \$6.00 a day for the group to perform a ceremony for Nixon and also the presentation. Second, motion carried.

Chairman James Hall: What about the uniforms for the police?

Discussion by the council.

Motion made to approve the purchase of uniforms for the police force of the ThreeAffiliated Tribes. Second, motion carried.

Motion made to have the list of names taken to the Area Office by the delegation and discussethe elegibility with Public Health. Second, motion carried.

Motion made to authorize Anna M. Morsette, Law Clerk (Typist), Census Clerk to automatically enroll members of the Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation and those questionable to be taken up by the Tribal Council. Second, motion carried.

Motion made to adjourr. Second, motion carried.

Chairman James Hall: I just wonder what would be the procedure about \$30.00.

Mr. Morken: Just write up a resolution before you draw a check.

Chairman James Hall: We have this justification of Carl Whitman Jrs, to bring up yet.

Motion made to reconsider Carl Whitman's request on his justification. Second

Vote: 7 for, 0 opposed, 1 abstention, Motion carried.

Valentine Wells: Carl Whitman being present in the meeting gave the following statement as I heard him.

Carl Whitman: Sometime ago on a trip to Washington, D. C. you fellows took which was important at the time, I was going to request that my justification be considered. You took one action and approved it, then rescinded it again. You were fumbling around like a bunch of kids.

I don't think my request was unreasonable. I wouldn't be foolish. It was approved once and disapproved. My request must have some merit which shows it now.

If I were to put actual mileage down, it would be three times as much. There must be something. I found out later my request was turned down. My future action will be determined. We live in a world of democracy, tribunals etc. I thought highly of the Council. If I am refused, I would like to know why. My request is equavalent to Civil Service. The most important is not what is said. That is why I am here today.

I want to thank you Council members. Whatever action you are going to take, if you are going to award me. If you wish, I can leave the room.

Chairman James Hall: You Ell have heard Carl, what do you propose to do?

B. J. Youngbird: I think we should have Carl stay in here, let him hear what the Council's action will be.

Carl Whitman: It is up to you Council members. Whatever you say or decide.

B. J. Youngbird to Carl: You are classed as a G.S.10. We are going to be bombarded from the outside just wait and see when this gets out.

Carl: I realize that.

John Wilkinson: I have all ready been bombarded. I didn't know too much about this work, auditing. Maybe Carl didn't realize what he was going to run into.

John Starr: I am going to say my piece. I didn't know when this took place. Carl has been a great healp to us, you all know that.
