First order of business was in reference to over-stocking on range units of Tony Fettig, Jr., and Ed Danks. There was some heated discussion on Resolution No. 69-20 with Land Operations. Discussion was both pro and con.

Motion by Adam Mandan to have a lawyer define parts of Resolution No. 69-20, seconded by Philip Ross, Sr. Remarks by Adrian Foote. He stated to find out if it would cause a conflict with our Constitutional rights of our Indian operators. Motion carried unanimously. Chairman not voting.

Ted Bolman, Jr., moved to have a lawyer check into this as soon as possible so the results can be made available to the people by Ted Bolman, Jr., seconded by Alfred Driver, Sr. Motion carried.

Two applications for a police position at Mandaree were presented to the Council for action. The two applicants were Gerald Hale and Lyle Baker. Motion was made to vote by secret ballot by Rose C. F. High, seconded by Philip Ross, Sr. Motion carried.

Ted Bolman, Jr., moved to have the police position temporary until June 30, 1970, seconded by Philip Ross, Sr. Motion carried.

Reading of the ballots were as follows: Lyle Baker received 6 votes and Gerald Hale received 1 vote.

Motion by Rose C. F. High to approve the proposed Communication Program by consumer aide, Robert Bell, seconded by Alfred Driver, Sr. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion to approve Resolution No. 70-50 pertaining to Hidatsa Village for National Park, seconded by Adrian Foote. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion to adjourn, seconded and carried.
