Chairman Gillette called the meeting to order at  $1:50~\mathrm{p.m.}$  and appointed Matt Mason as Acting Secretary.

Roll call, quorum present.

LAND SALE: Acting Secretary Mason read resolution regarding land sale for

Richard and Barbara Finley.

Councilman Goodiron moved to authorize purchase of Allotment 2205, 100 acres, from Richard Finley at appraised price of \$11,000. Second by Councilman Eagle. Seven (7) in favor, motion carried. Resolution #81-59

Councilman Fagle moved to authorize purchase of Allotment 2205, 60 acres, from Barbara Finley at appraised price of \$6,600. Second by Councilman Mason. Seven (7) in favor, motion carried. Resolution #81-60

CHR PROGRAM: Jim Foote, CBR Director, was asked to speak next. He reported on the five surburbans the CHR Program has, what condition they were in, the work and repairs they will need, etc. He suggested putting them on bids and going strictly GSA. He said that would be cutting expenses in half. Chairman Gillette said it will have to be considered when Treasurer White is here. It was decided to have Jim Foote put all information on paper and present it to the Council for consideration at a later date.

SEMINAR. Acting Secretary Mason read memorandum from Dr. C. Michael Newman regarding Governmental Relations Seminar slated for Washington.

D.C. on March 24, 25, and 26, 1981. This was presented to the Council for information.

LAW ENFORCEMENT: Acting Secretary Mason read resolution regarding hiring of Ouentin Beston as a BIA police officer. Supt. Fields was asked why his contract was not renewed. He reported that they had to hire within Department of Interior because of the hiring freeze. Resolution was tabled.

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RANGE UNITS: Chairman Gillette reported that on February 9, 1981 Natural Resources Committee went on record to allocate Range Unit 18. Supt. Fields said tribe can put in their bid and if nobody else bids or bids higher, they would be able to lease it.

Vice-Chairman Little Soldier moved to authorize submitting bid of \$57 AUM for Range Unit #18. Second by Councilman Eagle. Seven (7) in favor, motion carried.

LANDOWNERS ASSOCIATION: Discussion was held on Landowners Association and Ft. Berthold Land & Livestock Association's appeal to higher grazing rate set by the Area office in Aberdeen. Vice-Chairman Little Soldier asked why the Landowners were not paid their money. Sunt. Fields reported that decision has not been made by the Indian Board of Appeals in Washington, D.C. on Land & Livestocks' appeal and if ranchers get injuction, this will also delay payment.

RESERVATION PROGRAMS OFFICER: Discussion was held on transfer of John Danks Sr. to Ft. Berthold as Reservation Programs Officer. Supt. Fields reported that Landowners Association got in contact with him and asked him to hold off until they came before the Council to present their views and concerns. It was decided that Council will meet with Landowners Association on Monday, at 10 a.m. on February 23, 1981.
