Chairman Gillette called the meeting to order at 1:10 p.m. Roll call, quorum present.

ANG COAL GASIFICATION PLANT: Mr. Joel Malarvie introduced personnel from ANG Coal Gasification Plant and Kaiser Engineers. He presented overview of the coal gasification plant. He said coal gasification is an effort to convert lignite chemically into substitute natural gas. He said two phases in the project are: (1) construction, which will take about 45 months, and (2) operational, which should begin in 1984. The construction phase started about a year ago.

Jack Carter, Kaiser Engineers Personnel office, explained there will be two types of employment at the plant: craft workers and white collar workers. The permanent staff will be hired beginning 1982-83 and construction work force increasing in 1981-82. Councilman Mason asked if the Tribe can set up a training program for about 10 to 15 persons from the reservation and have their personnel come here to train them. Mr. Carter replied they have not set up any training programs yet, and are working with the State of North Dakota. Job Services did a work force analysis on jobs in 1980. There will be need for maintenance technicians. A Course Curriculum is being developed at Bismarck Junior College for a one year training program. When they are through with that project, then he said it might be appropriate at that time to consider whether or not they can have an instructor come here to start working with people on the reservation. Secretary Walker said people on the reservation are skilled but do not belong to a union and asked what procedures the Tribe needs to follow to ensure that our people will have a chance. He suggested contacting various unions.

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Homer Ludwig was mentioned as doing a study on needs and not receiving a letter of support from the North Dakota tribes except for Standing Rock. Secretary Walker said she understood there was to be a meeting set up with the North Dakota Indian Affairs Commission's Development Committee. Jack Carter asked if maps, regulations on the recreation sites in the Lake area could be sent to him. Chairman Gillette suggested further discussion of ANG's water permit for industrial purposes from the federal government as it affects Fort Berthold water rights. The meeting was set for Wednesday, September 9, 1981.

RECESS: The meeting recessed at 2:10 p.m. and reconvened at 2:30 p.m.

MINUTES: Secretary Walker read minutes.

Councilman Yellow Bird moved for approval of August 8 and 25, 1981 Judiciary Committee minutes. Second by Councilman Eagle. Vote: Eight (8) in favor, motion carried.

Councilman Mason moved for approval of August 19, 1981 Material Resources Committee minutes. Second by Councilman Eagle. Vote: Eight (8) in favor, motion carried.

Treasurer White moved for approval of August 20, 1981 Executive Committee minutes. Second by Secretary Walker. Vote: Eight (8) in favor, motion carried.

Treasurer White moved for approval of March 24, May 5, May 13, May 19, and May 26, 1981 Human Resources Committee minutes. Second by Councilman Eagle. Vote: Eight (8) in favor, motion carried.

TRANSFER AGREEMENT: Transfer agreement between the Indian Health Services, Fort Berthold HOusing Authority, Parshall Community and the Three Affiliated Tribes to serve Mutual Self Help housing units on the reservation was presented and reviewed. The agreement was referred to the Material Resources Committee and G. Russell Gillette, Material Resources Administrator, for full review.

ROSEBUD SIOUX TRIBES: Copy of letter to Chairman of the Select Committee on Indian Affairs from the Rosebud Sioux Tribe was presented for review and action pertaining to the Tribal State Compact Act of 1981, an Act to authorize the State and Indian tribes to enter into mutual agreements and Compacts respecting jurisdiction and governmental operations in Indian country. Included was a resolution opposing the Act.

Vice-Chairman Little Soldier moved to refer letter and resolution to the Tribal Attorney for review. Second by Treasurer White. Vote: Seven (7) in favor, one (1) not voting, motion carried. SPECIAL MEETING PAGE THREE AUGUST 27, 1981

HIDATCO, INC.: Memorandum from Hidatco, Inc., requesting loan was presented and reviewed. The request was referred to the Credit Committee for research.

Letter from Hidatco, Inc., addressed to the TERO office was presented in regard to trucking companies in violation of Tribal Ordinance by transporting oil and oil by-products without a tribal permit. After review, the Council decided to refer this matter to the Tribal Attorney.

ATTORNEY FEES: Secretary Walker read resolution for payment to Wilkinson, Cragun & Barker for legal fees and expenses.

Councilman Yellow Bird moved to authorize payment to Wilkinson, Cragun & Barker in the amount of \$4,473.90 for legal fees and expenses rendered for the month of July, 1981. Second by Councilman Eagle. Vote: Seven (7) in favor, one (1) not voting, motion carried. Resolution #81-192

INMED: Secretary Walker read INMED request for appointment to the INMED Advisory Board.

Secretary Walker moved to appoint Roy Bird Bear to the INMED Advisory Board. Second by Treasurer White. Vote: Eight (8) in favor, motion carried.

Councilman Mason moved for approval of resolution supporting the efforts of the INMED Program. Second by Councilman Eagle. Vote: Eight (8) in favor, motion carried. Resolution #81-193

BOND SCHEDULE: Alan McKay, Game & Fish Programmer, presented a draft bond schedule for Council consideration. A lengthy discussion followed on the pros and cons of the schedule.

Treasurer White moved for approval of bond schedule. Second by Secretary Walker. Vote: Four (4) in favor, four (4) opposed, motion defeated.

Chairman Gillette informed members that the Natural Resources Committee had reviewed the schedule and recommended it for approval.

CHAPTER 18 CODE: Secretary Walker read resolution and proposed changes in the Chapter 18 Code, which was revised and updated by the Game & Fish Programmer, and had approval of the Natural Resources Committee.

Secretary Walker moved for approval of the proposed changes in the Chapter 18 Code for hunting and fishing. Second by Treasurer White. Vote: Four (4) in favor, four (4) opposed, motion defeated.

DEER HUNTING SEASON: Alan McKay said he was recommending a moratorim on deer hunting this year because there were not enough deer. After discussion, Chairman Gillette suggested this matter be on the agenda for the next meeting. SPECIAL MEETING PAGE FOUR AUGUST 27, 1981

SHELL CREEK IRRIGATION: Councilman Mason distributed memorandum in regard to the Shell Creek Irrigation requesting that he and others in the community take the alfalfa at \$8.50 per acre for the second cutting. He stated Leonard Driver, Alfred Driver and Jerry Driver would be involved.

Councilman Yellow Eird moved to authorize Matt Mason and Jerry Driver to cut alfalfa in the Shell Creek Irrigation project at \$8.50 per acre. Second by Councilman Little Owl. Vote: Six (6) in favor, two (2) not voting, motion carried.
