ITEM 1 CALL TO ORDER

Chairman, Coffey, called the meeting to order at 1:00 P.M.  
and appointed Edmund White Bear as Acting Secretary.

ITEM 2 ROLL CALL

Acting Secretary, White Bear, called roll; quorum present  
(3 Members present).

ITEM 3 ARCHEOLOGICAL SURVEY GROUP

DISCUSSION: The survey group is doing work solely in Dunn  
County and Mountrail County and wanted the Three Affiliated  
Tribes to be aware of their presence on the Fort Berthold  
Reservation and to answer any questions they may have.  
Chairman, Coffey, asked the survey group to keep the Committee  
apprised of what they find and the location.  
Pete Froelich informed the Committee that the survey group  
is exploring surface sites along the lake, to photograph and  
record for the Corps of Engineers who hired them to conduct the  
survey. Tribal Council Member, John Charging, asked if the  
Tribal Business Council would have access to the survey  
reports and findings. Mr. Froelich stated that at the end  
of the next year (1986) the Tribal Business Council of the  
Three Affiliated Tribes will receive twenty-five (25) copies  
to distribute. Pemina Yellow Bird, Member of the State  
Historical Board, asked Mr. Froelich if the artifacts that the  
archeological survey group finds will be returned to the Three  
Affiliated Tribes after they have been photographed and  
recorded. Mr. Froelich informed the Committee that all  
artifacts discovered become federal property. Mr. Froelich  
commented that if the Fort Berthold Reservation had a museum  
or facility that met the state standards, a possible agreement  
with the Corps of Engineers could be worked out to recover the  
artifacts.
