## Special Council Meeting November 29, 1991

ITEM 01: CALL TO ORDER:

Meeting called to order at 2:33 PM.

ITEM 02: ROLL CALL:

Roll called by Secretary Rabbithead.

Quorum established.

ITEM 03: RESOLUTION/NORTHEAST QUANDRANT: Resolution #91-174.

Resolution read by Secretary Rabbithead. This authorizes application to BIA for Attorney Fees.

Discussion: Question was brought up regarding litigation. Response was it involves research and discovery. Resolution to be amended on 4th whereas to read "through court litigation, if necessary, and;"

It was mentioned if information on this issue that in 1981, the Tribe accepted the accounting claim. Our attorneys were asked the same questions regarding the oil and gas rights. They responded by saying in 1910, the only known mineral was coal, therefore they reserved only a part of the area of coal and in there, at the same time, there is a letter that the Tribal Business Council in 1950's stated that they cannot prove the government did not reserve oil and gas for the Three Tribes.

Chairman Wilkinson stated the challenge would be on the methodology that was applied on the reservation of minerals. The research would entail, did they reserve oil and gas minerals in other parts of the nation and yet not on Fort Berthold. Special Council Meeting November 29, 1991 Page two

> NE QUANDRANT RESOLUTION (CON'T): Other suggestions made to add and deletions to resolutions made, however, it was stated this doesn't authorize the filing of a lawsuit but prepares for one.

Chairman Wilkinson entertained motion for approval.

Vice Chairman Hall made a motion for approval, seconded by Secretary Rabbithead.

ITEM 04: RESOLUTION/FORECLOSURE: Resolution #91-175-JJR. Chairman Wilkinson stated this resolution should read on behalf of Dennis Snow. Resolution read by Secretary Rabbithead.

Question regarding what type of foreclosures? It was stated the intent of the resolution is for those that are being foreclosed on. The Economic Development Team will be meeting with FMHA Manager, David Hilleran on Monday morning/8:00 AM for those those that we can assist administratively but unfortunately there's some that action has been taken that we need to deal with. Discussion on foreclosed land to be purchased by the Tribe. It was mentioned we have directed Mr. Morgan to prepare the necessary documents on these land acquisition funds with FMHA.

Chairman Wilkinson entertained a motion to approve.

Treasurer Bird Bear made a motion to approve, secon ded by Vice Chairman Hall.

Vote: 7 for, 0 opposed. Motion Carried.

ITEM 05: FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE/AMATEUR ATHLETICS UNION REQUES Letter read by Secretary Rabbithead. This is a request from six students who are going to the National Cross Country Meet in Birmingham AL on December 7, 1991. They are requesting for financial assistance to defray their expenses at \$100.00 per student. The runners are Fred Hale, Manny Shepherd, Dion Standish, Gordon White Owl, McKenzie Wounded Face and Marty Young Bear.

It was suggested that the Council should help these students since it is a non-school function and the

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE (CON'T): school would not pay for it.

There was a question if the school has supported any non-school functions in the past? Gilbert White Owl, on behalf of the runners, responded by saying the school had no obligation to support the amateur athletics.

It was mentioned that Mr. Lone Fight, School Superintendent was contacted regarding this issue, on if the school could defray these expenses with some type of grant and the response was yes and the information was relayed to the Treasurer of the Tribal Business Council. Mr. Lone Fight further stated the school board already met the night before and wouldn't meet again until December 10 but it would need their approval so this is made as a point of record.

Councilman Gillette made a motion to approve for the amount requested but the Tribe be reimbursed from the School district if the funds are available after the school board meets, seconded by Councilman Lone Fight.

Chairman Wilkinson acknowledges motion and second.

Vote: 7 for, 0 opposed. Motion Carried.

ITEM 06: RESOLUTION/REDISTRICTING: Resolution #91-176-JJR. Resolution read by Secretary Rabbithead. stated the purpose of this resolution is a followup to the proposal by the Three Affiliated Tribes. One was to put us into the Legislative district, also to establish a subdistrict for the Fort Berthold Reservation for a house seat. The plan proposed by the State of ND must also meet the test of passing or addressing past racial discrimination that occurred. The reason we felt it was necessary is because there is millions of federal dollars that flows into the State of ND. By having an elected person or an opportunity to elect a person from the Three Affiliated Tribes to be involved in the House of Representatives is crucial and this person would convey our thoughts, our issues, our position and State matters.

REDISTRICTING RESOLUTION (CON'T):

It was mentioned this Legislative district takes effect December 1 and we should check it out, if we did get shortchanged and if there's grounds for a lawsuit, so be it.

Corrections needed to be made were on 6th whereas: Legislative to Legislation-7th whereas: Legislative to Legislature and addition to include other boundaries like telephone cooperatives such as in Twin Buttes. Due to two telephone cooperatives, phone calls are long distance. Also New Town and Parshall shouldn't be long distance either.

On second page, change should read after pursue against the State of ND, "on this and other issues"

Chairman Wilkinson entertained a motion to approve.

Vice Chairman Hall made a motion to approve, seconded by Secretary Rabbithead.

Vote: 6 for, 1 opposed. Motion Carried.

ITEM 07: RESOLUTION/DEVELOPMENT OF MINERALS: Res. #91-177. Resolution read by Secretary Rabbithead. This resolution authorizes Chairman Wilkinson to meet with Pete Aguilar and other Personnel of the Division of Energy and Mineral Resources to contract the function of this division.

It was mentioned that a referendum involving realty was passed in 1989.

Changes on 5th whereas to delete "desires" to reword "through public law 93-638".

Chairman Wilkinson entertained motion to approve.

Councilman Lone Fight made a motion to approve, seconded by Vice Chairman Hall.

Vote: 6 for, 1 opposed. Motion Carried.

ITEM 08: RESOLUTION/LCM BOARD OF DIRECTORS: Res. #91-178. Resolution read by Secretary Rabbithead.

The purpose of this resolution is we are trying to get LCM-SBM certified.

Discussion: Was there any alternatives by anyone?

ITEM 09: RESOLUTION/TRIBAL COURT TO EXERCISE JURISDICTION: Resolution #91-179-JJR. Resolution read by Secretary Rabbithead.

Question on what's the issue that brought this resolution up? Elmarie Conklin called into the meeting to explain.

Elmarie stated this case is concerning a non-Indian married to a enrolled member who were involved in a car accident in the boundaries of the Fort Berthold Reservation. This couple is suing a Insurance CO.

Another non Indian ran into this woman's vehicle and she filed suit in Tribal Court because of her children who are Indians. The Insurance Company and the other party are saying Tribal Court does not have any jurisdiction over them and we're saying the Court has jurisdiction.

Chairman Wilkinson entertained motion to approve.

Vice Chairman Hall made a motion to approve, seconded by Councilman Gillette.

Discussion: It happened on Highway 8. They are not disputing that but the only thing is, they are all non-Indians except for the children so we're saying our court hasn't limited itself in jurisdiction.

Vote: 5 for, 0 opposed, 2 not voting.
Motion Carried.

ITEM 10: 1989/1990 AUDITS:

Marcus Wells, Comptroller stated he has prepared letters for Chairman Wilkinson's signature regarding support of Indirect Cost.

Treasurer Bird Bear was out of the meeting so discussion was on Councilmen who were interested in attending the NCAI Conference in San Francisco. The following Councilmen will be attending: Austin Gillette, Jim Mossett, Theodore Lone Fight, III and Titus Hall.

Back to financial requests: Treasurer Bird Bear stated we could go with '92 but we get the money from the Education contracts.

Clarice Big Back is requesting for \$1,000.00. Councilman Lone Fight made a motion to approve \$1,000.00 for Clarice, seconded by Treasurer Bird Bear.

Discussion: It was mentioned Clarice was going to graduate school. If we get monies from '92. We are going to hurt these undergraduates worse. Treasurer Bird Bear stated we are not utilizing our graduate program.

It was mentioned to amend this motion to take this out of T-2.

Vote: 4 for, 2 opposed, 1 not voting.
Motion Carried.

Maynard Demaray is requesting for \$1,500.00.

Councilman Lone Fight made a motion to approve \$1,500.00 for Maynard, seconded by Treasurer Bird Bear.

Discussion: It was mentioned that this will set a bad deal for us if there is no grounds to turn all future requests down.

Vote: 4 for, 2 opposed, 1 not voting.
