

#### **CALL TO ORDER:**

**ROLL CALL: Present:** Chairwoman V. Judy Brugh, Councilman Eagle and Councilman Strahs. A quorum was established with three members present. The Chief Executive Officer, Richard Mayer, and Human Resources Director Val Finley were also present.

### 01. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: March 6th 2011:

Councilman Strahs moved to approve the March 6<sup>th</sup> 2011 minutes.

# 02. KIDNEY DIALYSIS UNIT: Director Stella Berquist:

- A) Roger Grady Jr. and Don Beopple, who are essential staff members of the Kidney Dialysis Unit inquired if they could have accumulated compensatory time paid to them. They are considered essential staff which makes it difficult to use the time. Councilwoman Brugh gave Acting Clinical Chef Executive Officer, Valerie Mayer and Tribal Chief Executive Officer, Richard Mayer a directive to research their records and give a recommendation at the next meeting of the Tribal Business Council.
- B) Simplex Grinnell Quote: The existing fire alarm system at the Kidney Dialysis Unit needs to be replaced—to be compliance with the State Committee Health guidelines and standard codes. The total replacement cost is quoted at \$15,555.00. Michael Steckler, who is an engineer with Indian Health Service, will meet with Stella Berquist to give expert advice on State Standard Health Codes. If the Tribe is not in compliance they could lose Medicare 3<sup>rd</sup> party billing
- **C)** Kidney Dialysis Units' Electrician and Floor Plan issues. Stella Berquist is currently working on finding the original the floor plan of the Kidney Dialysis Unit, because of electrical problems. Councilman Eagle recommended getting in contact with Kenny Stevenson and Ron Slack, an Engineer from Minot to locate the floor plans. Also, the building needs to have sixteen battery pack lights installed. Councilwoman Brugh recommended Chief Executive Officer, Richard Mayer and the Legal

Counsel meet with the Administrator to draft up a letter requesting the importance of locating the plans.
