

CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order by Committee Chairman Arnold Strahs at 11:30 am.

PRAYER: A moment of silence was taken instead of a prayer.

ROLL CALL:

Present: Committee Chairman, Arnold Strahs, Committee member, Barry Benson, Committee member Scott Eagle, and Committee member V. Judy Brugh. A quorum is established with four members present.

01. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Committee member Scott Eagle moved for approval of the August 30, 2011 and October 12, 2011 upon further review. Councilman Benson seconded the motion.

VOTE: 4 Ayes. Motion carried.

02. APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

Committee member Scott Eagle moved for approval of the agenda as amended. Committee member Barry Benson seconded the motion.

AMENDMENTS:

VOTE: 4 Ayes. Motion carried.

03. REGIONAL TRIBAL CONSERVATION ADVISORY COUNCIL:

Councilman Barry Benson moved to recommend to the Tribal Business Council to become active in the Regional Conservation Advisory Council (RTCAC) and accept recommendations for membership in Resolution format, upon nomination by the Tribal Business Council. Councilwoman V. Judy Brugh seconded the motion.

VOTE: 4 Ayes. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION: The Natural Resources Administrator suggested Jim Mossett as a nominee. She will contact him to see if he'd be interested in serving the term which is for 3 years.

04. FRED POITRA GAME AND FISH (Defer left the meeting.

05. CHRISTIAN LIPKE, SPEC. OPS. LLC

Spec-Ops, LLC is requesting approval to develop scoria and gravel to sell and give back 20% to the tribe. The Natural Resource Administrator was directed to do a back ground check on their finances.



06. DAVE WILLIAMS, CEO MISSIOURI RIVER RESOURCES:

Committee Member Barry Benson moved for approval to recommend to the Tribal Business Council approval of the request from Missouri River Resources desires to enter into a lease with the Tribe for approximately 320 acres located in Section 7, T146N, R92W Tract No. M2017 of tribal mineral interests at the following terms: Primary Term: Five (5) years with an ultimate term of 25 years. Royalty: twenty-six percent (25%). Committee Member Scott Eagle

VOTE: 4 Ayes. Motion carried.

07. ENERGY SUMMIT REVIEW W/COMMITTEE:

Review of the Energy Summit very well put together. Ken thanked NRC and Strahs for endorsing this type of

08. CARSON HOOD, Jr. /FRED FOX TRIBAL WELL PAD COMPLIANCE

Carson Hood, Jr., and Fred Fox presented a proposal recommending initiation of a Memorandum of Agreement with the Land Management to provide work for the compliance surveillance issue. A solution would be to develop compliance officers who will monitor the well pad. After visiting with Bureau of Land Management and Bureau of Reclamation—a possible 638 contract with the BLM was recommended. Natural Resources Administrator Young Bird suggested the NRC committee meet with Energy and Environmental to review the code.

09. <u>TEXX LONE BEAR - EASEMENT PROGRAM</u> <u>Metcalf Archaeology:</u>

Councilman Scott Eagle moved for approval of the proposal from "Metcalf Archaeology" Scope of Work to do a Class I Inventory of the Fort Berthold Reservation, at a cost of \$40,000, at no cost to the Tribe. Councilwoman V. Judy Brugh seconded the motion.

NOTE: The money will be recouped back from McKenzie Electric, and RTC Coop.

VOTE: 3 Ayes. Motion carried.

10. HOME SITE APPLICATIONS:

The Tribe acquired the tract of land (Mrs. Fast Dog's house) that was to be auctioned because of unpaid back taxes from the 1990's. Annette Young Bird clarified that Dennis Nash, a family member was awarded the lease to that lot. Gilson Mandan used to occupy a tribal house which is now condemned.



11. TRIBAL FLEXIBILITY OF SIGNATURE AUTHORITY:

Councilwoman Brugh moved for approval to recommend "Tribal flexibility of Signature Authority to the Natural Resources Committee Members, on all documents approved by them." Councilman Eagle seconded the motion.

VOTE: 4 Ayes. Motion carried.

12. VERDELL SMITH - HOMESITE AND BUSINESS LEASE:

Verdell Smith submitted a business proposal named Spotted Bull Trailer Court to ask for tribal land to develop a 60 Lot Trailer Court to house Tribal members soon to be evicted from Prairie Winds Property. He also presented a proposal to the Tribe to lease land next to Delores Sand residence. The people who are soon to be evicted from the Prairie Winds Court discussed in detail the timeline for eviction, also the prices outrageous. Scott Eagle said he'd negotiate it out.

13. MARVIN DANKS: RADIO TOWER USAGE:

Committee member Scott Eagle moved for approval to give the authority to DJD Consulting and Oil Field Services to utilize the three towers of KMHA, providing the KMHA Board concurs that it doesn't interfere with the usage by the KMHA Radio station. Councilman Barry Benson seconded the motion.

VOTE: 4-0. Motion carried.

14. LAND TRADE 612-A-G JAMES SMITH:

As single owner of 612-G, Tribal elder gift deeded it to his daughter, Shannon Mann. He later asked her if he could buy the land back —but she had already sold to the tribe. He was advised by Natural Resource staff that it was possible to trade land or to buy the land back. James is going south for medical help and will not be available. His brother, Harry Sitting Bear, has his Power of Attorney while he is gone and will negotiate for him. The Director of Natural Resources will walk him through the process. No action taken.

NOTE: Committee recessed for 20 minutes. Committee member Barry Benson left the meeting and didn't return.

15. <u>LEEANN GONZOLES</u>:

Committee member Brugh moved to reimburse Leeann Gonzales the total amount of \$1643.13 that she put into the trailer home for renovation to make it inhabitable. Committee member Eagle seconded the motion.

DISCUSSION: The trailer lots are not matching the leases. Only four of the trailers in the Thunder Butte area are inhabitable

VOTE: 3 Ayes. Motion carried.



16. FRITZ BIRD BEAR LAND EXCHANGE:

Tribal member would like to exchange land with the Tribe. Its located in the NE corner up on the ridge and down the coulee. No action taken.

17. TRIBAL LAND EXCHANGE FOR RICHARD E. MAYER:

Committee Scott moved for approval of a Tribal Land change between Richard E. Mayer and his allotted land trade. Committee member Brugh seconded the motion. (Not clear about the land description – no hand out. No description.)

Richard is currently working on a tribal land transfer south of the North Segment building in exchange for his land that is located in Parshall and Four Bears area. It was noted that in previous Natural Resources Meeting Mr. Fox said he would present the request. The Natural Resources Department NRD will draft a Resolution to recommend approval.

VOTE: 4 Ayes. Motion carried.

18. **IHS SERVICES REQUESTED**:

Committee member Brugh motioned to approve the five applications for septic systems. Committee member Eagle seconded the motion.

Further discussion by committee members was the need to hire additional legal counsels who are familiar with Indian land issues, water rights, and the Tribes Natural Resources. The Energy Director, Fred Fox will be invited to the next meeting for an update.

30. KAREN & MURPHY SITTING CROW HOME SITE LEASE POUCH POINT:

Assessment Corp of Engineers was to check into that and they wanted to stay in the double wide all season and it was just seasonal. Did they designate it as tribal land with no jurisdiction? It is under a master lease. Does the Corp. own land? No tribal land jurisdiction trailer park tribal land. Corp has jurisdiction where the land is higher.

(This needs better clarification.)



31. JR. FOOTE LEASE EXPIRED.

Councilwoman Brugh moved to direct the Natural Resources Administrator to order a cease and desist to Adrian Foote, Jr., reclamation to get all his machinery off the land at the Lost Bridge Scoria Pit. Councilman Eagle seconded the motion.

32. Councilman Scott Eagle moved to adjourn the meeting at 7:35 pm. Councilwoman V. Judy Brugh seconded the motion.
