Their mother is on a ventilator and they are pushing her stress on top of illness. Look into Medicare....Byron Baker, MD practices in Bismarck and willing to work things out with her. Basic narrative and try to answer them. Cost average is \$1,000 a day. Assign Valarie Mayer to get her on Medicare/Medicaid. Move her close to home where Dr. Baker can work with her. We can move her close to Bismarck.
