

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF  
THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE  
FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

WHEREAS, This Corporation is an Indian Chartered Corporation as defined by the Indian Reorganization Act of June 10, 1934, and authority is granted under said Act, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Business Council, under Article VI, Section 4 (b) of the Constitution and By-laws, is authorized to promulgate ordinances governing law enforcement on the Fort Berthold Reservation and to set courts for the trial and punishment of offenders against such ordinances, and

WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 5(d) authorizes the Tribal Business Council, Three Affiliated Tribes, to negotiate contracts, and

WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 5(e), authorizes the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes to encumber Tribal lands, interests in lands, or other tribal assets.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes, Fort Berthold Reservation, North Dakota, have anticipated approximately \$187,200 be appropriated, for cost of administration to carry on tribal activities, in the 1973 preliminary budget as outlined in Schedule A and B.


C E R T I F I C A T I O N
