

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY
 THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES
 FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

Resolution No. 79-191

WHEREAS, this Corporation is an Indian Chartered Corporation as defined by the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and authority is granted under that Act, and

WHEREAS, the Natural Resources Committee of the Tribal Business Council approved the purchase by the Tribe the land described below, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is in the best interest of the Tribe to acquire the land, and now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Business Council hereby approves the purchase of the land described below, exclusive of minerals, including oil and gas, from

Clarence Spotted Wolf, and others

for a cash consideration of \$ 27,200.00, which is the present fair market value, utilizing funds from the JUDGEMENT FUNDS - account, and hereby authorizes the Chairperson of the Tribal Business Council, its Secretary, the Superintendent of the Fort Berthold Agency, the Area Director, and Commissioner of Indian Affairs to prepare all documents and do all things necessary to transfer title of the lands to the United States of America in trust for the Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation, to wit:
