## RESOLUTION OF THE TRIBAL BUSINESS COUNCIL OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and authority under said Act; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Business Council has passed Resolution No. regarding the enforcement of the tresspass and malicious mischief statutes upon those outside the criminal jurisdiction of the Tribal Court; and
- WHEREAS, the existing sections 14 and 15 of Chapter 4, of the Tribal law and order code are inadequate for such enforcement; and
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Chapter 4, section 14, Malicious Mischief be amended to read as follows:

Any person who shall maliciously or knowingly and willfully injure destroy or disturb any property, whether real or personal, shall be deemed guilty of malicious mischief. If the offender is within the Court's criminal jurisdiction upon conviction he or she shall be sentenced to a period of confinement not to exceed 6 months or a fine not to exceed \$500 or both, plus any damages to be paid as restitution to the injured party.

Should the offender not be within the criminal jurisdiction of the Court upon conviction a fine not to exceed \$500 plus any damages to be paid as restitution to the injured party.

NOW BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Chapter 4, Section 15, Tresspass be amended to read as follows:

Any person who shall go upon the property of another knowing it to be property of another without proper permission by the owner or beneficial owner of said property shall be guilty of the offense of Tresspass and upon conviction shall be sentenced to a period of confinement not to exceed 6 months or a fine not to exceed \$500 or both plus any damages to be paid as restitution to the injured party.

Should the offender not be within the criminal jurisdiction of the Court upon a finding of unlawful tresspass a fine not to exceed \$500 plus any damages to be paid as restitution to the injured party.
