

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF  
THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE  
FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

WHEREAS; This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and authority is under said Act; and

WHEREAS; The Constitution and By-Laws of the Three Affiliated Tribes authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities for the welfare and benefit of the Tribe and Tribal members; and

WHEREAS; The Three Affiliated Tribes Tribal Council has reviewed the status of the trust funds on deposit in the U.S. Treasury; and

WHEREAS; The Tribal Council formally approved the budgeting of their funds; and

WHEREAS; The Three Affiliated Tribes has gone on record by Resolution No. 79-226 to utilize \$64,142.00 of the Docket 350F trust funds programmed for "Parks & Recreation" to renovate & repair their laundromat that is situated in the Four Bears Park.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Business Council hereby requests that the subject U.S. Treasury funds be withdrawn and placed in the Agency Depository upon approval of this Resolution.

Explanation of Tribal Program - U.S. Treasury Funds

Name of Tribe: Three Affiliated Tribes

Reservation: Fort Berthold

Agency: Fort Berthold

The Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984) makes tribal funds to the Three Affiliated Tribes in the Treasury available for expenditure without annual authorization by Congress. The funds are for use of engaging in all tribal activities that will further the economic well-being of the Tribes and to engage in any activity of a nature not inconsistent with law and within the Provisions of the Charter ratified on April 24, 1937.

It should be noted that the amount programmed for fiscal year 1979 is based on anticipated income. The Oil & Gas Bonus funds are reflected under Acct. 97.62.

All of the activities are operated under the Constitution and By-Laws of the Three Affiliated Tribes approved on June 29, 1937. Resolution No. 79-10 is for the fiscal year 1979. Revised on Resolution No. 79-68 - \$50,000, 79-76 - \$40,000, 79-15 - \$15,000, 79-69 - \$180,000, 79-60 - \$25,500 and 79-91 - \$200,000. Revised FY 1979 Tribal Budget, supported by Tribal Resolution No. 79-101.

Permanent Authorization (Estimated 1979 \$568,737)  
Indefinite Authorization (Estimated 1979 \$804,300)

The Three Affiliated Tribes is an organized tribe under the IRA Act and under their Constitution and Charter, the Treasurer is authorized to accept and disburse funds belonging to the Tribe. This official is bonded in the amount of \$50,000.

The Bureau of Indian Affairs administers a relending program in the name of the Three Affiliated Tribes for members (enrolled) and the tribes' are adding \$100,000 of their own funds to the program. Other funds involved in the program are Bureau Revolving Loan Funds. Revised FY 1979 Tribal Budget, supported by Res. No. 79-

The Three Affiliated Tribes owns and maintains a 9-hole Golf Course. Due to high Maintenance Costs, the Tribe has decided to purchase their own Maintenance equipment as per Resolution No. 79-

The Three Affiliated Tribes owns and maintains a laundromat and camper facility. The amount requested here is to renovate and repair this facility per Resolution #79-226
