WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and authority under said Act; and

- WHEREAS, The Constitution and By-Laws of the Three Affiliated Tribes authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in acitivities for the welfare and benefit of the Tribe and tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Business Council desires to operate a Youth Conservation Corp on the Fort Berthold Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, The operation of YCC will allow for employment of twenty-four (24) enrollees composed of youth from the surrounding area; and
- WHEREAS, Through their efforts needed conservation work will be accomplished on the Fort Berthold Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, The youth employed will develop an understanding and apprciation of natural resources.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Three Affiliated Tribes desires to contract for the administration of a ten week Youth Conservation Corp at a total cost of \$19,999.42.

This camp will be a non-residential camp with a total of 24 enrollees, 12 tribal members to be selected by the contractor and 12 non-members to be selected by the State of North Dakota Job Services Division.

Total contracting costs are \$19,999.42, this cost does not include enrollee's salary.

PLAN OF OPERATION

Goals & Objectives

This program is being administered to accomplish needed conservation work on the Fort Berthold Reservation, to provide gainful employment for enrollees between the ages of 15-18 years, and to develop an understanding and appreciation of natural resources of the Fort Berthold Reservation, as authorized by Public Law 93-597 and memorandum of understanding between the Department of Interior and the Department of Agriculture. The program is to further the development and maintenance of the natural resources of the Fort Berthold Reservation by the youth who will ultimately be responsible for maintaining and managing their resources. Needed conservation work on the Fort Berthold Reservation will be accomplished, by prioritization of projects based on the Tribal Governing Body's decision.

Organization, Methods & Procedures

The Youth Conservation Corps will be a properly balanced and integrated program of working-learning experience. The program will apply a variety of projects with a mixture of youth according to sex, age, and economic backgrounds.

The Contractor shall provide all necessary qualified camp supervisory staff, furnish transportation to and from central location to project work site, materials required for conservation projects, supplies and support services required to carry out the eight-week Youth Conservation Crops Program.

Qualified personnel living in the community will be hired by the Contractor when available to carry cut the program and projects.

Measurement of Progress & Accomplishment

The Camp Director will be required to make a bi-monthly written report to the Tribal Governing Body on the activities of ongoing projects and education activities regarding their progress and accomplishment. The Contractor will furnish a copy to the Program Manager.

Position Descriptions

<u>CAMP DIRECTOR</u>. The Camp Director serves as the principal official for the operation and management of the Four Bears YCC camp.

Camp Director:

1.

- is directly responsible to the Federal agency sponsoring the camp to implement and carry out the YCC program within the framework of applicable laws, regulations, delegations, and other guidelines and limitations.
- provides leadership and supervision for all camp activities and all personnel assigned to the camp.
- is responsible for the welfare, health, education, work, recreation, and safety of enrollees aged 15 through 18 years.
- is responsible for necessary administrative services pertaining to procurement, storage, and distribution of supplies; maintaining required financial management controls and records; personnel management, contracts, and arrangement for services which cannot be provided within camp resources; and general management.
- is responsible for good community relations and mutual understanding with nearby communities in matters which affect enrollee, and endeavors to resolve problems which arise.
- supervises camp activities in development and conduct of approved recreational program, counseling, and other off-duty activities. He/she is responsible for discipline of the enrollees both in the camp and in the surrounding communities, and is responsible for carrying out work projects which have been approved by higher organizational levels in accordance with controls perscribed, and subject to inspection for compliance with such controls.
- is responsible for staff orientation and training. Staff training shall include, but is not limited to, organizing, planning, scheduling, and administering programs that meet all goals and objectives of the YCC program. The Camp Director is responsible for creating an atmosphere in which staff members are totally committed, not only to their specific areas of responsibility, but to the overall success of the YCC program.
- 2. Environmental Awareness Coordinator. The Environmental Awareness Coordinator works under the supervision and guidance of the Camp Director.
 - is responsible for the planning, development, implementation and evaluation of an integrated environmental work/education program which will meet the goals and objectives of the YCC program.
 - is responsible for development of environmental awareness training for staff and enrollees, and will conduct training by individual work groups or combination of work groups, as appropriate.

<u>Work Coordinator</u>. The Work Coordinator works under the supervision and guidance of the Camp Director. He/she is responsible for carrying out field work project assignments and provides leadership and supervision to Group Leaders who direct work at field project sites. Work Coordinator will coordinate his work project program with the Environmental Awareness Coordinator, and Keep him/her advised of changes in work schedules or projects that would affect the environmental awareness aspects of the program. The Work Coordinator will assist the Environmental Awareness Coordinator in the environmental awareness training of the work group leaders, youth leaders, and enrollees:

- plans and directs the activities of 3 Group Leaders on work projects with responsibility for assigning enrollees to work crews, observing work in progress, and inspecting completed work for adequacy and conformity to standards; He/she complies and maintains records and reports of work projects.

- assures that materials, tools, and equipment are provided and that all assigned work is performed in a safe manner.

<u>Group Leader</u>. The Group Leader works under the direct supervision of the Work Coordinator in conducting natural resource conservation work for a group of 8 - 10 enrollees. The Group Leader is responsible for carrying out work assignments and insures that work is performed in a safe manner. The Group Leader keeps invididual records of project assignments. He/she provides guidance and counseling to enrollees assigned to the work crew and perfroms other camp functions as assigned by the Camp Director,
