## Resolution #81-14

## RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and
- WHEREAS, the Constitution and Bylaws of the Three Affiliated Tribes authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities for the welfare and benefit of the tribes and tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Business Council has the responsibility to provide for effective judicial services on the Fort Berthold Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, that the Fort Berthold Reservation currently does not have reciprocity agreement with the State of North Dakota and that all traffic offenses that are committed on the Reservation are not being sent to the Safety Responsibility Division of the State Highway Department; and
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that it shall be a criminal offense for persons to drive while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or controlled substance and the fine for persons violating this offense shall be a maximum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) and/or thirty (30) days in jail or the Tribal Court shall withold the defendant's druvers license and suspend his/her driving privileges on this reservation for a period of six (6) months.

## CERTIFICATION

I, the undersigned, as Secretary of the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation, hereby certify that the Tribal Business Council is composed of 11 members of whom 7 constitutes a quorum, 9 were present at a Special Meeting, thereof duly called, noticed, convened and held on the 29th day of January, 1981; that the foregoing resolution was duly adopted at such meeting by the affirmative vote of 8 members, 0 members opposed, 0 members abstained, 1 member not voting and that said resolution has not been rescinded or amended in any way.
