RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and authority under said Act; and

WHEREAS, The Constitution and Bylaws of the Three Affiliated Tribes authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities for the welfare and benefit of the Tribe and tribal members; and

- WHEREAS, Title II of the Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978 authorizes the Secretary of Interior to make grants to Indian Tribes for the establishment of Indian Child and Family Services; and
- WHEREAS, The Three Affiliated Tribes Child Welfare Program has been functioning for the past four years with significant annual financial support; and
- WHEREAS, The Three Affiliated Tribes wishes to make the Child Welfare Program a more efficient, highly respected entity.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Three Affiliated Tribes under the authority of Title II of the Indian Child Welfare Act contracts with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for financial assistance in the amount of \$101,568.00 for the Child Welfare Program for a one year period, beginning July 1, 1982.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, or Treasurer of the Three Affiliated Tribes shall be allowed to negotiate and sign on behalf of the Tribal Business Council.
