- whereas, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and authority is under said Act, and
- WHEREAS, the Constitution and Bylaws of the Three Affiliated Tribes authorizes the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities for the welfare and benefit of the Tribe, and Tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Natural Resources Committee has approved the exchange of lands between the Three Affiliated Tribes and Dennis Snow under the terms and conditions as stated below, and now
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tribal Business Council approve the exchange of lands helds in trust by the United States of America for the Three Affiliated Tribes and lands held in trust by the United States of America for Dennis Snow , 301-U380 under the terms and conditions as stated below and hereby authorizes the Chairman of the Tribal Business Council, its Secretary, the Superintendent of the Fort Berthold Agency, the Area Director, and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs to prepare all documents and do all things necessary to exchange lands for which title is to be transferred to the United States of America in trust for the Three Affiliated Tribes and Dennis Snow , 301-U380 under the terms and conditions as stated below:

Tribal Allot. No. 597A - $E_2^1NE_4^1$, $NE_4^1SE_4^1$, $N_2^1NE_4^1NW_4^1SE_4^1$, Sec. 18, T. 152 N., R. 94 W., containing 125.00 acres, exclusive of minerals. Valued at \$17,500.00 or \$140.00 per acre.

In exchange for an undivided 3244/12960 interest in Allot. No. 223A - N2SW4, S2NW4, Sec. 2, T. 148 N., R. 90 W., containing 160.00 acres, exclusive of minerals. Valued at \$33,600, with Dennis Snow's interests valued at \$17,646.75. A difference in value to be paid from the Judgment Fund Revenue Account in amount of \$146.75.
