

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF
THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE
FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and
- WHEREAS, The Constitution and Bylaws of the Three Affiliated Tribes authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities for welfare and benefit of the Tribes and tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, The Wahpeton Indian School Board was established in 1970; and
- WHEREAS, The Wahpeton Indian School Board represents the Omaha Tribe, Three Affiliated Tribes of Fort Berthold Reservation, Standing Rock Sioux Tribe, Menominee Tribe and Turtle Mountain Tribe and have a vested interest in the education of all Indian Youth; and
- WHEREAS, The timing of the announced closure of the Wahpeton Indian School was not adequate for a fair evaluation and the plans for closure was not consulted to the Wahpeton Indian School Board or the tribes they represent; and
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Wahpeton Indian School Board file a lawsuit against the Bureau of Indian Affairs for not consulting the Wahpeton Indian School Board or the tribes involved in a correct and reasonable manner.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes support the Wahpeton Indian School.
