WHEREAS, The Constitution and Bylaws of the Three Affiliated Tribes authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities for the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and tribal members; and

- WHEREAS, \$21,720.00 has been allocated to the Mandaree Community for Coal Conversion from fuel oil is presently available and that the Mandaree Community members have decided that a propane heating system is more feasible; and
- WHEREAS, Propane furnaces have been ordered with installation to begin within one month for the heating conversion; and
- WHEREAS, The balance if any, of the sum allocated will be used to purchase the first order of propane.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the sum of \$21,720.00 allocated to the Mandaree Community for Coal Conversion is hereby approved to pay for a propane heating system for the Mandaree Community Hall.
