

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF  
THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE  
FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and
  - WHEREAS, the Constitution and Bylaws of the Three Affiliated Tribes authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities for the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and Tribal members; and
  - WHEREAS, the Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation have always been considered an integral part of the INMED Program efforts; and
  - WHEREAS, the Three Affiliated Tribes has designated a INMED Advisory Board member and has assisted in setting Board policy and priorities for the recruitment and selection of INMED students; and
  - WHEREAS, the INMED Program has five (5) first-year medical school slots available for five-state area enrolled members and scholarship monies for undergraduates, medical students, and other allied health students including a high school summer Institute; and
  - WHEREAS, the INMED Program recruits and provides various recruitment material to the Three Affiliated Tribes for distribution purposes to the grade school, high school, community colleges and other educational organizations which request such information; and
  - WHEREAS, the INMED Program recruits and gives priority selection to the five-state area applicants for the high school, undergraduate, and medical school applicants as well as the INMED scholarships which are available through the program and the University of North Dakota.
- THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Three Affiliated Tribes, Tribal Business Council recognizes the need for Indian Health professionals and requests the American Indian students be given a fair and equal opportunity to seek health professions;
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Three Affiliated Tribes, Tribal Business Council support the efforts of the Indians Into Medicine Program located at the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and urges that adequate financial support be made available to the INMED Program/University of North Dakota School of Medicine as it is essential to the further development of the Indian Health Manpower and alleviate the shortage of
