RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and
- WHEREAS, The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes generally authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Business Council recognizes the imporatance of agricultural enterprises to the economy of the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, The Three Affiliated Tribes Tribal Business Council as both the governing body and largest landholder on the Reservation desire to protect and increase the value of the agricultural lands and enterprises on the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, The Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS), of the United States Department of Agriculture, plays an important role in both the stabilization of agricultural commodity prices and conservation practices on agricultural lands;
- WHEREAS, The ASCS is currently organized on a county basis, that is there are six county ASCS Offices for the Fort Berthold Reservation, which has proven to be a cumbersome organizational structure for both individual Indian agricultural operators and the Three Affiliated Tribes.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, The Tribal Business Council hereby requests that the one ASCS Office be established for the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation, and that the Natural Resources Department work towards this goal on the Tribes behalf.
