RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and
- WHEREAS, The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes generally authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, The Garrison Reformulation Act of 1986, Pub. L. 99-294, authorized substantial irrigation and municipal, industrial, and rural (MIR) development projects on the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, The Congress, through Pub. 99-294 has authorized the following amounts for these above identified purposes:
 - (1) Approximately \$60 million for the irrigation development of 15,200 acres on the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation; and
 - (2) \$20.5 million for MIR development on the Fort Berthold Reservation and other reservations in North Dakota.
- WHEREAS, The Congressional committee report accompanying the Garrison Reformulation Act recognizes that the purpose of these authorized projects is to partially compensate the Three Affiliated Tribes for the adverse social and economic impacts associated with the implementation of the Pick-Sloan Program on the Fort Berthold Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, The Garrison Reformulation Act of 1986 represents a significant compromise between all contending groups regarding the fiscal, environmental, and social aspects of that project; and
- WHEREAS, The prompt and realistic implementation of the Indian features of that project on the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation would provide significant health, environmental and economic benefits to the Three Affiliated Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, The administration's budget proposals on Garrison funding for fiscal year 1988 will significantly delay the implementation of the Indian projects authorized by that act:

The Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation urges your Committee, by formal resolution, to restore the funding in the FY 1988 Bureau of Reclamation Budget for the Garrison Diversion Unit. The restoration of this funding is essential to the implementation of the Indian features of this project on the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation. The Garrison Reformulation Act, Pub. L. 99authorizes substantial irrigration and municipal, industrial, and rural (MIR) water development projects on the Fort Berthold Reservation as well as on two other Indian reservations in Noŕth Dakota. These Indian projects, if public would provide great implemented environmental, and economic benefits to the Three Affiliated Tribes as well as to the other tribal people intended to be served by the project.

The Administration's budget proposal for FY 1988 Garrison funding would dash the tribal people's hope. Therefore, the Three Affiliated Tribes urges your committee to act to restore the Bureau of Reclamation funding to the level of \$34.9 million.

The Three Affiliated Tribes greatly appreciate your continued support for this important project.
