**RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF  
OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE  
FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION**

- WHEREAS,** This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and
- WHEREAS,** The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes generally authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS,** Article IV, Section 3 of the Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes grants to the Tribal Business Council all necessary sovereign authority, both legislative and judicial for the purposes of exercising the jurisdiction granted by the people in Article I of the constitution; and
- WHEREAS,** Parts of the Fort Berthold Reservations have been declared to be in a disaster area, some areas have not been so designated; and
- WHEREAS,** The Tribal Business Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the Three Affiliated Tribes that all land within the boundary of the Fort Berthold Reservation be designated as a disaster area; and
- WHEREAS,** This shall enable livestock operators to harvest forage from conservation reserve acreage to provide much needed feed for the upcoming winter months; and
- WHEREAS,** The Tribal Business Council wishes to ensure a supply equal to the needs of the participants in the Reservation wide Tribal Heifer Project; and
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** That all land within the boundary of the Fort Berthold Reservation shall be designated as a disaster area in order to qualify the CRP lands for harvest.
