

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF
THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE
FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and authority under said Act: and
- WHEREAS, The Constitution and ByLaws of the Three Affiliated Tribes authorize and empower the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities for the welfare and benefit of the Tribe and Tribal Members; and
- WHEREAS, The membership of the Three Affiliated Tribes have suffered instances of family violence in the forms of child abuse/neglect/abandonment and spouse abuse; and
- WHEREAS, Locating immediate shelter for victims of family violence on short notice/emergency basis is often difficult; and
- WHEREAS, The Office of Community Services/Administration for Children and Families, Department of Health and Human Services is making available direct grants to Indian Tribes for Fiscal Year 1995-1996. Family Violence Prevention and Services Funding under Public Law 102-295; and
- WHEREAS, The Three Affiliated Tribes meets the application requirements as an eligible Indian Tribe and is listed as Tribes over the population of 3,000 for qualifying for the grant; and
- WHEREAS, The Three Affiliated Tribes received a grant of \$40,000. in Fiscal Year 1995 through 1996 and has demonstrated need that greatly exceeds this amount; and
- WHEREAS, The Social Services Program of the Human Resources Department has established expertise and procedures for providing services/assistance to victims of Family Violence.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes hereby authorizes and directs the Social Services Program/Human Resource Department to execute and file the attached application for Family Violence Prevention and Services funding in the amount of \$40,000. including the required assurances as listed.


Attached is our grant application for the Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation in North Dakota, Aberdeen Area Office and recognized as Tribes over 3,000 population. Our grant is being submitted to provide direct service to victims and their dependents of domestic violence for FY'95.

This year we were unable to meet the funding deadline of November 1, 1994 because of Tribal elections and because the funding proposal which we prepared was not able to get approval from our Tribe. This was due to several political problems our tribe was facing with the election of Tribal Chairman. There were no business meetings I'm not sure if your office is familiar with the many situations this presents for programs such as ours in getting necessary paperwork to be executed and submitted with our grant application.

The new Tribal Chairman as of Novemer 8, is Russell D. Mason; and he was sworn into office on Thursday, November 10. We were then able to get his signature & approval on our documents. We realize we are asking your office a monumentous favor to accept our proposal on this date and consider us for funding but we feel it was worth a try. We depend on this grant for all our direct services funding.

Your consideration will be appreciated. With the first meeting of the new Tribal Business Council we will submit our Resolution granting our agency authority to submit this application and to administer programs and activities through this same funding.

1. Tribal Business Council, Human Resource and Judiciary Committees.
2. Three Affiliated Tribes Social Services and Child Welfare Program.
3. Fort Berthold Bureau of Indian Affairs Law Enforcement Services and County Law enforcement: Mountrail & Mckenize.
4. Three Affiliated Tribes Tribal Court.
5. Indian Health Service Social Services, Minni-Tohe Clinic.
6. North Dakota Council on Abused Women's Services.
7. Minot, Dickinson, Williston, and Bismarck Shelters.
8. Casey Family Program Counseling Service.
9. Child Protection Team.

Other Agencies include Legal Assistance of North Dakota, Circle of Life, Child Nurturing Classes, Schools, and Churches on the reservation in providing support, referrals and information, education, advise, and supportive services for clients seeking assistance.

Three Affiliated Tribes has also organized a Children's Council, Community Response Team, and Parshall Resource Center Day Care/Social Skills Center which addresses the child abuse and family violence issues on Fort Berthold.

PLANS TO USE GRANT FUNDS TO PREVENT
INCIDENTS OF FAMILY VIOLENCE

Federal Family Violence is Fort Berthold Coalition Against Domestic Violence Program's main source of funding for direct services to their clients. These direct services include: Emergency Shelter, Shelter-Contract Care (Off-Reservation) Child Care, Transportation, Emergency Food, Emergency Clothing, Training/Workshops/Conferences, Education, Intervention, Referrals for Counseling, Child Nurturing, Presentations to Schools, Colleges and Groups on Domestic Violence and Abuse, participation in school fairs and reservation awareness conferences, Women's support groups and referrals for appropriate health care services (i. e., alcohol and drug abuse) program certification for legal court advocacy, and brochure & pamphlet material for education & awareness of domestic violence on the reservation & services available are the other services provided by FBCADV. The services mentioned are self explanatory for the purposes of this grant. See budget breakdown for detailed line description.

In 1993, 176 victims were served, (See attached North Dakota Statistics & Fort Berthold Coalition Against Domestic Violence data sheet for January 1, 1993 - December 31, 1993.) Statistic for 1994 will be available January 1, 1995 for the State Networking Office.

Included in this year's grant are expense required to provide direct services. Training will be provided to the board, faciliator training, support groups and clients.

PLANS TO PROVIDE SHELTER AND RELATED ASSISTANCE
TO VICTIMS OF FAMILY VIOLENCE AND THEIR DEPENDENTS

Victims of Abuse referred to our office by agencies or self, they are assisted with the protection order process, and provided options to go to a shelter or safe shelter. They receive direct services as provided by this program, i.e., child care, food, rent, clothing, transportation, referrals, supportive services are provided by other agencies as well. Each client is informed of areas that they would receive assistance.

These services are provided to victims and their dependents.

MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS

Fort Berthold Coalition Against Domestic, Violence maintains records of client contact for statistical purposes (i. e., to provide data to funding sources and for research purposes) and for information purposes (i. e., to aid in evaluating programs and facilitating communications between staff/volunteers).

Individual files of clients are kept in a locked filing cabinet. The key for the file is maintained by the staff. Client folders are not available for review by students or board members except under compelling circumstances and then under the supervision of the Executive Director or her delegate.

No statement of a client should ever be written verbatim. The writer should sign and date each entry, noting that the client has not verified the entry.

Client files should not reflect legal conclusions except as these notations are made by attorney's, acting as counsel for the client.

Statements of evaluation or opinion should be kept to a minimum in client files. Entries of evaluation or opinion should be approved by the counseling supervisor. Similarly, entries about drug and alcohol abuse/consumption should be approved by the counseling supervisor.

Students working in the program are not authorized to make entries in client files. Counseling notes of student's supervision file. If or when student notes are released to college professors, all identifying material must be removed from these notes, including the name of staff, volunteers, battered women, children and other students.

All entries in a client file must be made in such a fashion that they are legible and in language familiar to clients.

Client files should be factual only and must not include interpretive, evaluative remarks about clients.

Essential communications about individual clients which cannot effectively be made orally to other workers in the program should be made in a memo form which is immediately destroyed by the recipient.

Written statement, letters, or comments of a battered woman or child not be kept in file except when they are critical to service delivery or advocacy. The battered woman should be carefully informed that any statement not addressed to workers in the program may not be deemed covered by the communications privilege by a court and might potentially be used against her. Furthermore, when a battered woman merely asks that the organization hold papers for her safe-keeping, those papers should not become a part of the client file but should be kept in a locked place where other client valuables are kept while women are worked with in the coalition. Materials that are kept merely for safe-keeping are not deemed organization records.

ASSURANCES

1. That not less than 70 percent of the funds shall be used for immediate shelter and related assistance to the victims of family violence and their dependents and not less than 25 percent of the funds distributed shall be used to provide related assistance (section 303(f)).
2. That grant funds made available under the Act will not be used as direct payment to any victim or dependent of a victim of family violence (section 303(c)).
3. That no income eligibility standard will be imposed upon individuals receiving assistance or services supported with funds appropriated to carry out the Act (section 303(d)).
4. That the address or location of any shelter-facility assisted under the Act will not be made public, except with written authorization of the person or persons responsible for the operation of such shelter (section 303(b)(2)).
5. That grantees receiving funds under this program will prohibit discrimination on the basis of age, handicap, sex, race, color, national origin, or religion (section 307).
6. That grantees will comply with Departmental recordkeeping and reporting requirements and general grant administration requirements of 45 CFR part 92.

APPENDIX C

U.S. Department of Health and Human Services

Grantees Other Than Individuals

By signing and/or submitting this application or grant agreement, the grantee is providing the certification set out below.

This certification is required by regulations implementing the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988, 45 CFR Part 76, Subpart F. The regulations, published in the May 25, 1990 Federal Register, require certification by grantees that they will maintain a drug-free workplace. The certification set out below is a material representation of fact upon which reliance will be placed when the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) determines to award the grant. "Controlled substance" means a controlled substance in Schedules I through V of the Controlled Substances Act (21 USC 812) and as further defined by regulation (21 CFR 1308.11 through 1308.15).

"Conviction" means a finding of guilt (including a plea of nolo contendere) or imposition of sentence, or both, by any judicial body charged with the responsibility to determine violations of the Federal or State criminal drug statutes;

"Criminal drug statute" means a Federal or non-Federal criminal statute involving the manufacture, distribution, dispensing, use, or possession of any controlled substance;


