RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, This Nation, having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and
- **WHEREAS,** The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes generally authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and of the enrolled members; and
- **WHEREAS,** The Three Affiliated Tribes Tribal Business Council is aware of the dire housing shortage suffered by members of the Three Affiliated Tribes and other Native Americans residing or wishing to reside on Fort Berthold, and
- **WHEREAS,** The Tribal Business Council agrees that members of the Three Affiliated Tribes and other Native Americans suffer this shortage more acutely than the general population, and
- WHEREAS, The Fort Berthold Housing Authority is a duly recognized Indian Housing Authority created under Tribal Ordinance, and, as such, is eligible under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Notice PIH 94-25 (IHA) issued May 24, 1994, to utilize a "tribal member" preference and "other Indian" preference in admissions to assisted housing programs, and
- **WHEREAS,** This preference will enable the Fort Berthold Housing Authority to insure that we, as a Tribe, better assist our tribal membership and our fellow Native Americans with badly needed housing,
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Three Affiliated Tribes Tribal Business Council hereby authorizes and directs the Fort Berthold Housing Authority to immediately implement within its Admissions and Occupancy Policies an admissions preference which prioritizes applicants for housing as follows: 1) Three Affiliated Tribes Tribal Members, then, 2) Non-Member Native Americans, and then, 3) all other applicants.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** That the Executive Director of the Fort Berthold Housing Authority shall be directly responsible to accomplish the procedures necessary for implementation, with the aid and approval of the Fort Berthold Housing Authority Board of Commissioners.

Subject: Native American Preference in Admissions to Assisted Housing Programs

<u>PURPOSE</u>: This Notice provides guidance on implementation of the Departmental policy allowing a preference in admissions for Indian tribal members and other Indians to assisted housing programs operated by certain eligible Indian Housing Authorities (IHA).

<u>APPLICABILITY</u>: This Notice applies to all eligible IHAs operating housing programs assisted under the United States Housing Act of 1937 (as amended), including but not limited to, Rental, Mutual Help Homeownership Opportunity, Turnkey III Homeownership Opportunities and Section 8.

<u>BACKGROUND</u>: Indian tribes with the governmental police power to promote the general welfare may establish an IHA pursuant to a tribal ordinance enacted by the governing body of the tribe (Tribal Ordinance IHAs). See 24 CFR 905.126. An IHA may also be established pursuant to a State law that provides for such establishment (State Law IHAs). See 24 CFR 905.125.

ELIGIBLE IHAS: All Tribal Ordinance IHAs are subject to the Indian Civil Rights Act (Title II of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, 25 U.S.C. \$\$1301-1303). As such, they are not subject to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. \$\$2000d-2000d-4) and the Fair Housing Act (42 U.S.C. \$\$3601-3620). All such IHAs are eligible IHAs under the terms of this Notice. The Department will determine, on a case-by-case basis, whether the tribes of State Law IHAs exercise the requisite powers of selfgovernment necessary to be classified as eligible IEAs under the terms of this Notice. Requests for such determinations should be made to the Director, Office of Native American Programs in Headquarters. The Department has concluded that IHAs created under Oklahoma State law are subject to the Indian Civil Rights Act and are therefore eligible IHAs under the terms of this Notice.

<u>IMPLEMENTATION</u>: An eligible IHA may, subject to tribal law, ordinance, resolution, or constitutional amendment, implement a system of preferences in admission which prefers tribal member Indians or other Indians over non-Indians in its Indian Housing programs.
