- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and
- WHEREAS, The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes generally authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes empowers and authorizes the Tribal Business Council to make expenditures from available Tribal funds for public purposes of the Tribes, including salaries or other renumeration for services rendered for the benefit of the enrolled members of the Three Affiliated Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Business Council proposes to integrate existing Indian Health Service and Tribal Health Programs for greater efficiency and effectiveness in health care delivery; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Business Council is contemplating the development of a comprehensive health care program servicing the Indian and non-Indian population on the Fort Berthold Reservation and surrounding communities; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Business Council advocates the strategic implementation of Public Law 93-638 and incorporated contracting provisions of Public Law 103-413 of all Indian Health Service programs to develop greater efficiency and effectiveness in a more beneficial delivery of health care; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Business Council elects to retain the services of Health Care Consultants to review Indian Health Service care and Tribal Health Programs and to provide recommendations for program change that will more beneficially and effectively accomplish the goal of a comprehensive health care program on the Fort Berthold Reservation and to surrounding communities; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Programs Manager and the Comprehensive Health Department request authorization and approval to enter into a Consultant Agreement, number TF-96-60, with Gary Leva and Rick Knorr of Benewah Medical Center, Plummer, Idaho; and

# HEALTH CARE CONSULTANT - GARY LEVA, RICK KNORR REVIEW OF HEALTH CARE PROGRAMS - IHS AND TRIBAL

Cost of review is as follows: \$1,000/day - for consultant team, plus - travel, and expenses. Travel and lodging to be arranged by the Three Affiliated Tribes. Phase I to be March 19, 1996 through March 22, 1996. Phase II tentatively scheduled during the week of April 22, 1996. Phase III tentatively scheduled during the week of May 20, 1996.

#### SCOPE OF WORK:

#### A. PHASE I. (March 19, 1996 through March 22, 1996)

- 1. Program Review
  - Indian Health Service Clinic
  - Tribal Health Program
- 2. Provide recommendations for program change to effect greater efficiency and effectiveness.
  - Exit interview for preliminary recommendations
  - Written report within three weeks of review.

- 1. Provide recommendations to integrate existing IHS and Tribal Health Programs to effect greater efficiency and effectiveness. Specific comments regarding:

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Tribal Business Council of the Three Affiliated Tribes hereby approves the amended Comprehensive Health Planner Budget to include a Consultant Line Item to accommodate the cost of the Health Care Programs Review.
