# RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and
- WHEREAS, The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes generally authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefits of the Tribes and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, Persuant to the "Blueleggs Decision", Tribes are federally mandated to provide proper collection and disposal of garbage on individual Reservations; and
- WHEREAS, The Natural Resources Department, Solid Waste Division provides garbage collection for all Tribal members throughout the Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Solid Waste Division does not receive any funding from federal, state or local agencies, other than collections from commercial entities; and
- WHEREAS, Although the collections provide sufficient funding for the day to day operations of the landfill; equipment failure and downtime contribute significantly to the depletion of the limited financial resources; and
- **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** That the Tribal Business Council hereby authorizes the purchase of one new compactor truck using Tribal funds. Said equipment purchases not to exceed \$120,000.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** That a lease/purchase agreement shall be subject to post review and subsequent approval by the Chairman and Treasure of the Tribal Business Council.


