RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18,1934, and the authority under said act; and
- WHEREAS, The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes generally authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and of the enrolled members;
- WHEREAS, During the 1996 growing season, ranchers and farmers who permit or lease Tribal Lands on the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation have suffered losses of crops and forage, including those used to produce hay; and
- WHEREAS, The economic distress of the members of the Three Affiliated Tribes has been increased by a combination of; hail, a cooler than normal spring which significantly reduced forage production, grasshopper infestation, early winter storms with abundant snow, and early winter extreme cold temperature. These conditions caused low weaning weights and forced operators into feeding livestock earlier than normal. This will deplete feed supplies, and force livestock onto range prematurely; and
- WHEREAS, It is the policy of the Government to conserve and improve natural and renewable resources such as soil, forage, fish and wildlife in a manner so they contribute to the continued livelihood of the people and the subsistence of many Indian people depends upon the livestock use of range forage; and
- WHEREAS, A combination of factors has occurred during the past eight months which has caused a financial hardship for farmers and ranchers who will fail and go out of business without substantial assistance from local, Tribal, and Federal Government; and
- WHEREAS, The President of the United States has declared a National Livestock Economic Emergency thereby allowing the haying of land under the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) which does not significantly benefit the Reservation since very little land on the Reservation is enrolled under the CRP, or additional equal assistance.

WHEREAS, That in order to help conserve our limited Natural Resources according to Resolution #96-243-DSB has declared the following counties within the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation as disaster areas: Mercer, Mountrail, McLean, McKenzie, and Dunn Counties; and

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Tribal Business Council establishes the Emergency Feed Loan Program. The TAT Emergency Feed Loan Program is here by established to expedite delivery of needed hay and grain to needy enrolled TAT Ranchers whom do not posses ample levels of livestock feed to maintain their foundation herds. The funding sources identified will be Docket 350-G for Business Development or as more funds become available. The TAT Emergency Feed Loan Program will establish funding to carry out the implementation of this program for 1996-1997 critical winter season.

Articles of the EFLP (Emergency Feed Loan Program)

- 1. Eligible participants shall be:
 - a. Enrolled members of the Three Affiliated Tribes, who are in need of Winter Livestock feed for the 1996-1997 winter season.
 - b. Participants with non-delinquent Tribal loans shall be 1st priority, participants with delinquent Tribal loans shall be second priority. (see item 5)
 - c. Applicant's sole income is from their cattle operations and will be prioritized lower if family has second income.
- 2. Eligible Livestock shall be cattle (and horses if primary source of income) 100% owned by eligible participants and branded with the participants registered brand. Compliance checks will be done by tribal staff prior to loan approval.
- 3. The participants will receive interest free feed loan. The feed loan repayment period will encompass a two-year period. First payment due Dec. 1, 1997 with final payment payable Dec. 1, 1998. If another disaster occurs within one year, another year's extension may be added by approval by the Tribal Business Council.
- 4. Participants must sign a promissory note and a trust income assignment and/or a voluntary wage assignment and any other tribal security documents neccessary.
- 5. TAT enrolled ranch member's in the EFLP must be able to prove their own Indian ownership. Eligibility payment will be \$50.00 per head for qualifying participants with no delinquent Tribal loans, with a maximum loan amount of \$2500.00. Participants with delinquent Tribal loans shall receive \$25.00 per head with a maximum loan of \$1500.00. Upon securing more funding the Tribe will offer another \$2500.00 to participants with non delinquent Tribal loans and another \$1500.00 to participants with delinquent Tribal loans. The same dollar amounts as stated above per head shall still apply.

6. Determination of eligibility will be based on the above criteria, administered by the Tribal small loans office and other Three Affiliated Tribes staff subject to a majority vote of the council.
