RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE FORT BERTHOLD RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, This Nation having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and the authority under said Act; and
- WHEREAS, The Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes generally authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the Tribes and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, Article VI, Section (C), of the Constitution of the Three Affiliated Tribes specifically authorizes and empower the Tribal Business Council to administer any funds or property within the exclusive control of the Tribes and to make expenditures from available Tribal funds for the public purposes of the Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, It is in the best interest and welfare of the Tribes to promote economic development and opportunities for economic development on the Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Council requires that previous to the release of any tribal funds for the purpose of assisting individual tribal member's economic or business development proposals, such proposals shall be complete and financially sound, and provide business documents; and proof of financial commitment from resources other than tribal, as well as any and all other information necessary for the Council to make a determination as to the business's feasibility; and
- WHEREAS, Enrolled Member Charles Foote currently owns and operates a business on the Reservation, and is in need of financial assistance to improve his business and to contribute to the economic development of our Reservation.
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Tribal Business Council does hereby appropriate to Mr. Foote and his individually-owned tribal business the following: § 3,500.00 Development Grant and \$ 3,500.00 Business Loan, such monies being appropriated from tribal revenues, subject to availability of funds and proof of the financial commitment and acquisition of outside resources.
