Message from Tribal Councilman Hall

Greetings,

It's been one year since you elected me to serve on our Tribal Government as your Tribal Council Representative and I can boldly say that we've seen a lot of progress and made a lot of changes. Change doesn't always happen quickly but we remain persistent in continuing the mandate given me to operate with high standards of Accountability, Transparency, Responsibility, and with Vision.

Every month we have published a newsletter providing updates and information. We incorporated social media and provide messages on Youtube, Twitter and Facebook to give all of our members an opportunity to be informed; especially the younger generation and those off reservation.

At the beginning of my administration we instituted the public forum of engagement called the Town Hall. It serves as an official function to receive input, provide solutions and collectively address the issues we all face. Now you have asked for monthly meetings so we will continue to rebuild our community together.

Where there were no policies or structures they've been created. The Tribal Council by resolution reinstated the North Segment Community Development Corporation to oversee economic development projects, the North Segment Security Department has been enhanced. They continue to address the lack of housing as a priority issue. We can report that the Van Hook subdivision is getting closer to be zoned as residential/commercial and we are moving forward on this project. We achieved major milestones when the Tribal Business Council lobbied for the successful passing of ND Bill #1198 which resulted in new terms in the Tribal State Tax Agreement. This established \$400 million in new revenue for our Tribe over the next two and a half years. Significantly higher than the original projection.


Another highlight that our office is most proud of is that we stayed within our means financially and spent only the Budget we were approved.



Budget Transparency

North Segment Expenditures FY 2013



Medical-158 people were helped with \$40,968.00. Financial-245 people were helped with \$151,289.00. Funeral-108 were helped with \$27,491.00.

CDC Report

In the recent Town Hall meeting, Elgin Crows Breast explained the role of the CDC, and gave a financial report. He shared that \$1.5 million has been assigned for infrastructure development, \$1.5 million for housing development, and that the Tribal Business Council has passed a resolution to grant a loan of \$1.4 million for land aquisitions in the North Segment.

Town Hall

The people assembled, asked Councilman Hall if he could prepare a financial report of all the tribal revenues and passed a motion requesting that a percentage of all tribal revenues would come into the Peoples Fund perpetuity. Councilman Hall will address this issue at the Tribal Business Council meeting in November.

I joined the National Guard in 95' and left my end of my junior year as a young 17 Year old, Basic Training Ft. Leonard Wood Missouri. Did the split option, graduated from Turtle Mt. High School in 96' and 'AIT' Advanced Individual Training in Ft. Sam Houston Texas, became a 91 Bravo 'Combat Medic'. After I welcomed my first child, in 97', I went on active duty and served with the 1st Cavalry HHB Divarty in Ft. Hood Texas. I am an RN, certified CPR & 1st Aid, CHOOSY Kids Fitness, Cooper Institute Group Exercise Instructor, Boot Camp Circuit Training/Balls, Bands & More Fitness Aerobic Instructor.

Arthur Mandan

Arthur Mandan, AKA Tommie served as a medic during his tour of duty in the US Army. Tommie's main scope of work within the North Segment Office structure

is to serve as the liaison between Elders and Veterans. We look to Tommie for his wisdom as a former Elementary School Teacher and an Elder. Mr. Mandan also serves as the North Segment appointee to the Nueta, Hidatsa, Sahnish College. Arthur earned his Bachelor's of Education degree from the University of North Dakota, and had earned his Nursing Degree from Fort Berthold Community College. He had worked at the MHA Circle of Life Program for a number of years, after he retired from teaching.

Arthur is an Army Veteran and earned a number of medals/awards. He was a paratrooper in Vietnam with the 101st Airborne Division (Screaming Eagles) and was the paramedic.
