Message from MHA Nation Tribal Business Councilman

Greetings.

The Pow Wow season is in full swing we want to invite you to the upcoming Little Shell Pow Wow held on August 8, 9,10, 2014. We look forward to seeing all the family and relatives that will be coming home for a visit and to enjoy the Pow Wow and the many events that are scheduled over the weekend. The North Segment Office will be hosting the second annual Peoples Feed on Friday August 9, 2014 at 5:00pm behind the announcers stand. Everyone is invited and welcome to come share a meal.

During the year the Tribal Business Council made budget decisions for Tribal Operations & Distributions. In December we approved a Disbursement of \$500.00 for all members. This was not from the Peoples Fund, however, we increased the Peoples Fund to \$200 Million dollars and the first Peoples Fund distribution of \$500.00 will begin July 20, 2014 through August 1st. We raised the Elders payment from \$600.00 to \$1,000.00 for both distributions in July and December. If you haven't received your Elders check you can call the Finance office at (701) 627-4781.

As a follow up to President Barak Obama's visit to North Dakota I made a trip to Washington D.C. to meet with Jodi Gillette, Sr. Advisor to the President, with our Congressional Representatives, Human Services Department, and with Mr. Roger Boyd from the Housing Authority. Mr. Ed Hall accompanied me to present the work of the MHA Tomorrow Initiative. It was a very productive visit as we informed the MHA Planning & Grants Office of available monies, and while at the Human Services office we were promised two FTE's for our Safe Haven Home here in New Town. The Safe Haven Home is a 5 bedroom which is located just North of FBCC across the street. It is ready once we get it staffed.

There is a lot development occurring and these are exciting, busy and demanding times. The North Segment Community Development Corporation is meeting deadlines on their projects and the Wooden Bowl Apartments is going to have their first occupants moved in before the Little Shell Powwow. Housing demand is still high and the "CDC" will begin the second apartment building mid-August and house another 20 families by October.

We will be having our Community Town Hall on August 5th and I invite you to come and get involved in the process of change. We will hear from different programs and we will be providing updates and reports on all of our activities. Until then, have a safe and enjoyable summer.

North Segment Community Development Corporation Provides 60 Homes at Very Affordable Prices



When Councilman L. Kenneth Hall took office as Tribal Councilman for the North Segment in 2012 he hosted a series of Town Hall Meetings to invite the community input into the Administration. In those public forums the people stated consistently that the greatest need in the community is "housing".

Consistent with the principles of Rebuilding Native Nations and creating structure for accountability and transparency, Councilman Hall revisited the Tribal Business Council Resolution, initially introduced by Councilman Malcolm Wolf, to create a "Community Development Corporation" with full oversight authority for all development within the North Segment. The Tribal Business Council passed that resolution to mandate the "North Segment Community Development Corporation" Board of Directors, to work in cooperation with the Office of the North Segment Tribal Business Councilman, Ken Hall, to address the business and development projects in the North Segment Community.

Building our Tribal Nation is our top priority. To that end, the North Segment Community Development Corporation "NSCDC" has been organically integrating structure within its organization as well as in its efforts of blueprinting a comprehensive land use plan for the North Segment, within the New Town area, particularly within the region adjacent to the new DOT bypass north of town.

The State of North Dakota is thriving, due in large part to the oil boom. Much of the State's oil production, about 1/3, originates within the boundaries of our Reservation. The Governor has stressed the importance of **planning for the subsequent growth**, which is a driving principle embraced by the "NSCDC". The NS Community Development Corporation Board of Directors has properly vetted their associated consultants with the intent of bringing a spirit of resourcefulness within the organization. To that end, the "NSCDC" has a team put in place to provide appropriate autonomy necessary to handle the challenges we face. We have prepared a Master Plan for Development with phases for implementation. It is "Planned Development".

The Housing Projects initiated by the "NSCDC" continue on schedule and within budget. The first phase, twenty (20) unit apartment building constructed within the Wooden Bowl estates will be ready for occupancy beginning the first week of August 2014. These "affordable" units are furnished with refrigerator, stove, washer, dryer and microwave appliances. Phase two Construction of the second twenty (20) unit apartment building will commence August 15, 2014, and is projected to be completed by the end of October 2014. The Cottonwood Mobile Home Park will have five (5) new mobile homes delivered to the Cottonwood Mobile Home Park and ready for tenants starting August 15th. Prospective tenants should stop by the Northern Lights building or visit our website at www.NSCDC.net for a rental application. Backgrounds check will be conducted on applicants.


