Greetings Everyone,

I have stated before and I will state it again, *“the Mandan, Hidatsa and Arikara Nation is in an unprecedented time in the history of our tribe”*. We have many challenges but at the same time we have enormous potential in front of us. Research tells us that if we are not good stewards of our finances that it will only last for three generations so we know that the decisions we make today will affect our grandkids, grandkids. That’s five generations. The world is watching how we manage our resources and more than ever before, it is vital that we have a financial plan to protect our revenues for the future, and, that we become good stewards of our finances.

I ran for Office on **Accountability, Transparency, Responsibility** and **Vision** and we are delivering. To demonstrate Transparency & Accountability, I published our budget for FY 2013 and now again for FY 2014. Once again we managed our resources, stayed within our means, and did not get wreckless with spending, for the FY budget year 2014 because it’s about Responsibility and Accountability. This is an accomplishment we can all be proud of. I would like to thank my staff for believing in this approach and for working hard to be Accountable, Transparent and Responsible to you, the people of the North Segment/Little Shell Community.

Our Annual Economic Development Summit is scheduled for **October 7 & 8, 2014** at the Northern Lights Wellness Center in New Town, ND. This year the theme is *“In the Spirit of Partnership”* and we have another outstanding line up of guest speakers. We hope you can come out and join us and get informed on the latest trends and challenges as well as the opportunities in the Bakken Oil Play.

We are continuing addressing the community housing, law enforcement and safety needs in the North Segment. Our NS Community Development Corporation completed the Wooden Bowl Estates I, affordable apartments, and it is at capacity. The Wooden Bowl II Estates is near completion and will be ready for occupancy by November 1, 2014. The Cottonwood Trailer Park has five new trailers that are being skirted and hooked up to utilities. The Elbowoods Clinic Phase 1 Housing is near capacity and Phase 11 has started.

In response to the Drug Task Force initiative the Council assigned finances to provide a Safe Haven Home, a safe place for kids in each segment. We had an Open House for the North Segment Safe Haven Home and it is getting ready to be staffed and be fully operational soon. We want to thank Marilyn Young Bird for leading this project. The Fort Berthold Community College has dedicated the Women’s Campus Dormitory to the late Alyce Spotted Bear and I attended the dedication and ribbon cutting ceremony with US Senator Heidi Heitkamp. It was a fitting dedication to a person that has devoted her life to young people in Indian Country. Congratulations to the Spotted Bear family.

Our Neighborhood Watch Program is inviting volunteers to sign up and it’s a great opportunity for all of us to keep our community safe. We will be adding two Resource Officers to the FY 2015 budget to continue to address the safety of the people and also to combat the crime and drug activity here in the North Segment community.

I would like to welcome Roger White Owl to the staff of the North Segment. He will be completing the work my office started in September 2013 to establish the MHA Nation Education Trust Fund. He is a valuable asset and we look forward to having him on the team. We will be scheduling a Town Hall and encourage you to come, to share ideas and solutions, and to get involved in the process of creating change. Get involved in the process of Rebuilding our Tribal Nation.

NORTH SEGMENT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

The "NSCDC - Corporation" projects were developed in cooperation with the Office of MHA Nation Tribal Councilman, Mr. L. Kenneth Hall, through the Town Hall meetings. They are officially supported by Tribal Council Resolution to give the Corporation full oversight authority in the North Segment.

The NSCDC was formed with the intent of adhering to Native Nation Building principles. **Nation Building involves reforming Tribal Government so as to:** maintain stability; match formal institutions to Indigenous political culture; reduce corruption and abuses of power; remove politics from dispute resolution; remove politics from business and program management. The NSCDC, in its endeavors, has shown itself capable of bringing viable economic development to our Segment while conforming to the ethics values of our Culture.

WOODEN BOWL ii & COTTONWOOD TRAILER PARK DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS *"Cruising Along to Finish on Schedule"*

The North Segment Community Development Corporation continues to be busy in its enterprise of bringing "affordable housing" to the North Segment Membership. The construction of the second phase, 20 unit apartment building of Wooden Bowl estates began August 18th and the completion is scheduled for the 3rd week of October 2014. The first building was completed ahead of schedule and under budget, and we have no reason to believe this project will be any different in regards to cost or timetable. The first unit is fully occupied and the second unit has a list of applicants that will fill it too.

Final schedule for Wooden Bowl Apartments - formula for rental rates is as follows: 2014 Fair Market rental rates using Mercer County rates at 80% + \$30, \$38, \$45 respectively for water/trash service. 1 bedroom- 10 available - \$459/month, 2 bedroom- 6 available - \$547/month, 3 bedroom- 4 available - \$796/month. Background checks are conducted on all applicants: successful background checks are given consideration.

MASTERPLANNING FOR INCREASED & PHASED IN DEVELOPMENT IN NORTH SEGEMENT

The "NSCDC" has forged ahead in its efforts of preparing a **Master Plan** for developing recently acquired property along the proposed truck bypass north of New Town. A comprehensive land use plan has been initiated, and much needed development is being proposed for the area to include a new 100 plus unit manufactured home park complete with paved roads, much needed single family housing, and additional commercial opportunities.

The Corporation meets regularly as a Board, with developers, with the City of New Town, and with the Community Members in the Town Hall meetings.

The "NSCDC" is a legal incorporated organization led by the Board of Directors: Mr. Elgin Crowbrest, PRESIDENT - Mr. Tom Hale, VICE PRESIDENT - Mr. N. Scott Baker, TREASURER - Mr. Arne Sorenson, SECRETARY - Tribal Councilman Hall - EX OFFICIO. The NSCDC are open business and can be reached at **701-627-3456**.



Our MHA Elders are one of the most valuable resources to our Tribal Nation. In this fiscal year the Tribal Business Council took action to increase the amount of the Elders Disbursement twice: bringing the total to, two yearly distributions of \$1,000.00 each. In North Segment we purchased a new bus for elders to use for elder trips and other needs. If you are in need of transportation services, call Mr. Arthur "Tommy" Mandan, Tribal Liaison at the Northern Lights Offices to schedule. He can be reached at 701-627-3456. This is a free service provided for Elders of the North Segment.

LAW ENFORCEMENT: Security. Neighborhood Watch. Resource Officers.

The safety of the people is our highest priority and we are continuing to take measures to increase law enforcement in the community. I assigned the Tribal Council Vehicle to the North Segment Security Division so they are now able to patrol the streets and highways. We revived the Community Neighborhood Watch Program that is under the Directorship of Mr. Jim Miller and he is actively recruiting volunteers to help keep our streets and homes safer. In the next month [October 2014] we will be adding two new Resource Officers to the Law Enforcement Team to serve and protect the Segment Members.

Under the Drug Task Force Initiative, The Safe Haven Home has opened up in N.S. and there will be additional ones in all segments phased in. The Tribal Law Enforcement Division currently has (3) three K-9 Units and they will be increasing the number of K-9's.

North Segment FY 2014 Budget Transparency ---- My Staff are managing your Tribal Resources with the highest standard of efficiency and responsibly. During the first year of my Administration we published our FY 13 Budget and now we are publishing the FY 14 Budget. Our North Segment Office assisted 155 people for Medical, 402 people for Financial, 136 people for Funeral, to total 693 people helped in the 2014 Fiscal Year. The Tribal Supplement for North Segment was \$1.55 Million and we added Revenues from Water Sales of \$676,469.68 to Supplement the Budget, for a Total FY 14 Budget Expense \$2,226,469.68.
