Greetings,

It's been a busy year again and a we've undertaken a lot of development initiatives at the Tribe and in the Segment. A few more big projects are being completed before another construction season comes to an end. On Wednesday October 28th, 2015 the New Town Main Street Project was open to traffic after the Ribbon Cutting Ceremony was held. The Governor of North Dakota Jack Dalrymple, New Town City Mayor Dan Uran, North Dakota Department of Transportation Director Grant Levi, District 4 House Representative Kenton Onstad, Councilman Ken Hall, North Segment Representative and many more dignitaries were all in attendance. Governor Dalrymple announced at the ceremony that in the next biennium that the State of North Dakota plans to spend \$2 Billion dollars to western North Dakota for infrastructure needs. The Main Street Project cost was \$20 Million dollars, just 1 year ago the Truck Reliever Route opened at a price tag of \$25 Million dollars.

The Tribe allocated \$26 Million dollars to another major construction project which is nearing completion: BIA Route #6 in Shell Creek. This project along with BIA #17, a \$29 Million project were completed with no financial assistance from the State of North Dakota or from the Federal Government.

I announced to the audience at the Ribbon Cutting Ceremony that since the Historic Oil and Gas Tax Agreement was signed in 2008, the Three Affiliated Tribes has contributed close to \$1 Billion dollars to the State of North Dakota and that the Tribe has done it's part in this government to government relationship to assist in infrastructure needs in western North Dakota.

The North Segment Development Corporation are finalizing their plans for the Red Hawk Estates which is two 36 unit apartment complexes which will be constructed on the acquired land purchase by the Tribe just north of the Elbowoods Housing District. The River View Trailer Park improvements include a new fence around the park along with installing curb, gutter, paved streets, and replaced sanitary equipment. In Van Hook there will be gravel added to the existing roads and those roads will be paved next construction season.

We will be hosting our 7th Indigenous Nations Economic Development Summit on November 16th & 17th in the newly remodeled Event Center now called the Grand Ballroom at the Four Bears Casino & Lodge. We want to invite everyone to come out and enjoy the speakers that will be presenting at our annual summit. Following that, the annual North Segment Community Thanksgiving Dinner will be held at the Northern Lights and you're all invited to come and share a meal.

I will be attending the White House Tribal Nations Conference on November 4th & 5th, 2015 in Washington, DC and will give an update at our next Town Hall Meeting.

I want to encourage everyone to stay involved on all the activities that are going on in our community and at the Tribe, and, I would like to wish you a safe and enjoyable Thanksgiving Holiday.

THE NORTH SEGMENT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION continues its plans of community development with a strict budget despite decreased oil revenues. Providing housing for enrolled MHA Tribal members remains a top priority for Councilman Hall and the NSCDC. The CDC will soon be digging footings for two new apartment buildings which will be constructed within the Tribal property north of the Elbowoods housing area. Each building will be comprised of 30 individual apartments, the majority of them being 3 bedroom units. The three story structures will include elevators, community rooms, and exercise rooms. Once the footings are in place, construction of the building framework will begin and continue through completion, which is anticipated to be late Spring.

The NSCDC will be purchasing the Golden Age Mobile Home Court by month end. We are excited about this acquisition and are hoping to add a few spaces within the park to accommodate additional homes. This purchase is emblematic of our endeavors of Rebuilding our Nation. To date, the NSCDC has purchased one other mobile home park, built two 20 unit apartment buildings, rehabilitated the old North Segment building in order to house college students, and bought two commercial buildings on New Town's Main Street. We have been striving to promote community planning, affordable housing, and commercial opportunities. We will be hosting a booth at the upcoming Economic Summit,
