Cowboying and Going To Rodeos Is a Way Of Life For Casey & Jimmie Stone

Their father was the IRA World Champion Bull Dogger in 1977 so both these young men grew up with the best teacher, their father Jimmie Stone Sr. also known as (Stoney). Who taught them skills and knowledge of horses and rodeos their mother Rosie Johnson also comes from a rodeo family, she provided the best support for both of their sons. Having the support and teachings of both their parents helped shape the lives of these young cowboys. Both of their sons have excelled in making a name for themselves in the rodeo arena. As they were growing up especially Casey, who spent many years in the practice pen, teaching and training horses. Casey has hit the hard dirt more times that ever and has traveled and hauled his horses thousands of miles. Which has all paid off for him, he won his first horse trailer two months ago in October, 2020. Casey won two world titles in the INFR in 2010 and 2015. Since then, he has won many titles, trophy buckles and trophy saddles too many to count. When Casey travels he participates in bull dogging, and tie down calf roping and team roping.

His brother Little Jimmie

also known as Bubba was in the Lone Star High School Rodeo Association for 3 years. In 1998, he was the State Champion steer wrestler in Abilene, Texas, which is the biggest Rodeo Association in Texas. In 2012, he was a finalist in bull dogging at the INFR. He was on the top 15 for a long time with United Professional Rodeo Association. Bubba was in the finals of the CWRA Cowboys Rodeo Association. He was won many trophy saddles in bull dogging as well. Today, unfortunately due to his health issues, Bubba only participates in the team roping events. There are people who have encouraged and supported Casey, his biggest supporter is his mother Rosie Johnson, who is so proud of her sons. To his dad and his brother, bubba who take care of his horses while he travels. To the MHA Nation for their support. Casey and his family are very grateful and appreciate the support. To all the young cowboys...DREAM BIG AND GO FOR IT!!! In the words of bubba. Casey and Bubba are enrolled members of the MHA Nation and they both reside in Oklahoma.

Councilwoman Turner-Lone Fight Update

Before I begin this months update, I would like to extend my deepest condolences to all the families and relatives who have recently lost their beloved ones. This past year has been very hard on everyone, when we live in a community where we are all know each other its hard to see our family and relatives go through a hard time. I do hope you are all keeping safe and wearing your masks and following our tribal Covid-19 guidelines.

With that in mind, since the last update, I have taken the time to go around the community checking various situations out and like I mentioned, I will be honest with you all. Most importantly, our own housing here is in dire need of repairs we are working on those at this time, we also have water issues that we have been fixing along with rural water with septic tanks and drainage problems. The duplex's down by the Black Eagle Estates are far from being complete, at this time we are trying to save them from rotting which will cause more damages to the homes. At the White Oak trailer homes the water has been repaired and the rent has been reduced. I am currently working with Shanna Fox on the Black Eagle homes.

The roads department has been out restoring the out of town roads and completing new homesite road requests. We have contracted two certified plumbers within our community who have been very busy with all the plumbing issues. Presently, we have three carpenters working in the community to repair all these building issues including the duplexes. The old community center is also under construction, we will be utilizing this for our rehab. This center is called CARE this is up and providing services to those persons in need and are conducting meetings. This program is in the infant stages now and I hope to see great things with this new CARE center for our community. We are losing too many people to this outrage drug addiction problem. We have a curfew for our community which is from 10pm to 7am, I ask each of you to please be in your home before this time. Chairman Fox and the council will be in the near future fining persons who are not following the COVID-19 guidelines.

West Segment is still in the process of collecting their tribal vehicles from the previous administration from employees. If you have one of these vehicles a stop and hold was issued on Monday the 14th of December, 2020.

TBC Meetings: Things are looking up for our West Segment, during the TBC meeting on Dec. 10th Chairman Fox and the TBC agreed to help out West Segment with funds for us to take care of the structures that are dilapidated and projects that were left unfinished. To save on funds we have given back the care of the Tribal Ranch to the TAT. In a recent visit with Chairman Fox about WSRC, he stated to me that WSRC would stay in the Mandaree community but would not fall under the umbrella of DOT & or Energy. Called DOT Satellite Station located in Mandaree and our equipment and personnel would be utilized here in our community. All the problems and majority of the oil field activity are here in West Segment will give them more power to stop truck traffic and other mis-happenings here in West Segment. As you have been told in the previous West Segment News, we are 20 million plus in debt with that said we have been utilizing our funds effectively. So West Segment can continue to serve our people and our needs.

Events:

For our Christmas plans this year, EnerPlus will provide gift baskets to households. West Segment will be giving out \$75.00 dollar gift cards. Christmas meal and toys for the children and teenagers. West Segment will have a gift exchange within the departments. Lorraine Howe has done a tree lighting ceremony to reembrace her late husband Sargent Mike Howe's Memory. The community is going to have a walk-in remembrance of community members who have passed on into the Spirit World. At dusk there will be a community parade of lights all West Segment departments are required to participate. Prizes will be given to community participates. All this will be on December 23, 2020 walk starts at 3:00pm and the parade at 6pm. The Spiritual walk-ride will be held on December 29, 2020 at 10:00 AM (CST) Junction of 14 & 17 (By Ethan's Hall's) Southeast of Mandaree. (See poster on page 28 for more details).

Mandarge C.A.R.E. Program

Greetings from the desk of the Mandaree C.A.R.E. Director:

My name is Vivian Hall and I greet you all with a humble heart today and I ask you for forgiveness from my people if I say or misrepresent anything in a way that offends anyone.

Councilwoman Sherry Turner-Lone Fight called on me to be the Director and assigned me a team of four amazing individuals who are in different stages of recovery.

We will be wearing many hats in this organization and we will all be recovery coaches. The Programs Manager is Kyle Mandan, the Program's Coordinator is Sydney Hunts Along, the Health and Wellness Coordinator is Kayla McKenzie and Lynn Marvel is our C.A.R.E. Advocate.

Mandaree C.A.R.E. Recovery Center is set to open their doors soon in 2021. C.A.R.E. is the acronym for "Compassion, Acceptance, Respect and Empowerment". This recovery center is unique and the first one of it's kind.

Mandaree C.A.R.E. will come together in four phases as of right now we are in Phase I. Phase I consists of getting our building ready, training our team, and preparing for phase II. Phase II will be building a client base for those in recovery or seeking recovery and providing services and Phases III and IV will be building more resources and finding out what is effective and what isn't.

Mandaree C.A.R.E. is a support for those in recovery or wanting to recover from any addiction but mainly focusing on alcohol and drugs. We plan to offer a variety of resources to the community for support in recovery. Our belief is when one person is sick the whole family is sick and when our community members are neighbors who are living next to the sick family it affects the whole neighborhood. C.A.R.E. wants to be a support system for the Mandaree Community. Our main focus is helping the addicts and alcoholics who are suffering with their families. Through this healing process we believe that we will have safe and healthy neighborhoods.

Some of the resources we will be offering are; community sweats and recovery sweats, exercise classes and healthy living classes, walking groups, community weight loss challenges, 12 step meetings for a variety of addictions, and 12 step meetings for family members and their children, Holistic healing, equine therapy and advocacy for the clients in the C.A.R.E. Program will be opening the Mandaree Healing Rooms for anyone requesting or needing prayers.


The process is simple, to use our services you must have a desire to stop drinking and/or using drugs and alcohol. We are here to assist those seeking treatment and those coming out of treatment, we also are here to assist those who are incarcerated and coming home to help them re enter society. It is our hope to build partnerships with various tribal entities to make our resources flow smoothly.

The intake process should take 15 to 30 minutes, if you are accepted into the Mandaree C.A.R.E and agree to the conditions of the program, you will then be led by your recovery coach to plan and build your program of recovery and utilize our resources. The family is strongly urged to participate in this process, as well and whoever the client lists on their application as support will be required to fill out a short form and can begin receiving services with their loved one.

During this COVID pandemic we will be using all the precautions necessary to ensure the safety of everyone working or volunteering and our clients and families. We will be utilizing Facebook with PSA's, the West Segment News, PSA's on KMHA to spread the word and let people know of upcoming events.

We tentatively plan to open for services in March 2021 and no later than May 2021. Our email is caremandaree@yahoo.com. So if you have any questions please email us and one of our staff will respond. Our offices are located inside the old community center the building used to be the old MEC Building. We look forward to serving our community. Our phone number is 759-3089.

This "desired good" will fully satisfy us. However, we cannot rely on our own strength to achieve it nor will it be "attained easily or readily." This "desired good" can only be obtained through grace freely given to us by God's ~grace to achieve it, grace to trust that God will give us this grace and the grace of confidence that God will take us to heaven. And the only way to receive these graces is to humbly and faithfully cooperate with God by using these graces. Supernatural hope seems complicated, but it is rather simple. All the tools (grace) are available anytime and everywhere. Cooperation means use them, that is, make little acts (prayers) of hope~"I trust you Jesus." "I believe you Jesus" "I love you Jesus" I place all my hope in you Jesus." When you find yourself becoming tired of wearing masks or waiting for that vaccine, make an act of hope~"Jesus, I am fully confident that you will give me what I need get through this. When you find yourself discouraged because you feel trapped, make an act of hope~"Jesus, I am absolutely convinced you will lead me to the freedom waiting for me in heaven."


